L2 Marking Criteria photography

From your theme and the research of your artist models create a body of work. This is a process that should evolve systematically as you proceed. It is important to keep updating your website to reflect on your work and document your ideas and artist models.

You will present your body of work on your website and a folio board spread to demonstrate your systematic development of your ideas across a minimum of 1 ½ folio boards. You will be assessed with your folio layout and supporting website against the 2.2 and 2.3 Achievement Standards.

In your assessment you will need to have evidence of the following in your e-portfolio:

- Clarified proposal
- How ideas have been formed and how connections have been made between your work and artist models.
- Experimenting
- Annotations about your ideas and evaluations of your work. You have to show your critical thinking
- How ideas, skills, processes and techniques are reviewed and refined along with reflection on the acquisition of skills and analysis of development as a visual artist
- Sustained working that has been informed by critical investigation of artists, artworks and artistic genres
 and evidence of how these have influenced and impacted own practice. You need to include established
 artist models and photos of your body of work. Explain, show how you used artist models in your
 e-portfolio.
- Sustained experimentation and manipulation of a variety of techniques and conventions and an ability to select art-making techniques appropriate to your stated intentions

Drawing methods refers to the use of media, techniques and processes to arrange elements (eg line, shape,

space, colour, tone, point, texture, form, mass) and principles (eg balance, harmony, rhythm, tension, contrast) to inform artwork. Photography drawing may include sketches, compositional notes, proof sheets, working prints, photograms, collage, montage and photographs.

Clarify ideas involves analysing, reflecting on, and further developing a concept, subject matter, problem or situation, in drawings appropriate to established practice.

Extend ideas involves critically analysing, evaluating, and further developing a concept, subject matter, problem or situation, in drawings appropriate to established practice.

Related series refers to a set of drawings that demonstrate a connection. Drawings refer to ongoing thinking, working and decision-making, which may involve different processes, procedures, materials and techniques.

Appropriate to established photography practice refers to the use of particular characteristics and constraints in

the drawings, from established practice within the field.

Established practice refers to works by artists that are recognised as belonging to a particular genre, style, convention, or way of working. The investigation of solutions found in established practice involves past and contemporary artworks.

Extending ideas (for Excellence) requires students to show the sustained advancement of pictorial and technical ideas to support new responses to a thematic or conceptual proposition. This typically means at least three distinctly different iterations of the investigation, with the first creating a series of work that is thematically / pictorially linked, the second clarifying ideas (for Merit), the third extending ideas (for Excellence). At least 2 changes to your work that are linked together and purposeful

An effective strategy to facilitate the advancement of personal ideas needed for higher levels of achievement is to introduce new artist models at each stage of the iterative process. This means the researching, developing, creating, evaluating process and when you get stuck and are repeating the same work you find new artists as inspiration.

Tasks that include an evaluative stage, where the strengths and weaknesses of outcomes are identified, tend to enhance students' opportunity to show the extension and regeneration of ideas. The strengths of preceding outcomes can then be used to inform new research and the development of subsequent art work. This contributes to a more systematic progression of ideas.

This is the documentation of your work and the reflection both personal and peer. You will need to make sure this information is included in your e-portfolio for submission. It is also the annotations on your website reflecting about your work.

After the .2 and .3 submission you will concentrate on extending and refining your work for the 2.4 submission. You do not need to continue with your website unless you wish to and so I can see your work to give feedback.

Keep refining your board layout until the folio print deadline!
