Author Summary	This resolution seeks to implement a constitutional amendment that requires Central Student Government (CSG) to spend at least 33% of all student fee revenue on funding for student organizations at the University of Michigan.

## Section 1.

**The Central Student Government Assembly finds and declares all of the following:**

**WHEREAS,**

Central Student Government (CSG) has a responsibility to financially support student organizations at the University of Michigan;

**WHEREAS,**

The current version of the CSG Compiled Code has a requirement that 51% of each budget is directed towards the Student Organization Committee (SOC);<sup>1</sup>

**WHEREAS,**

Changes to the Compiled Code do not require a direct student vote and therefore can be changed with no direct student input;

**WHEREAS,**

Changes to the All Campus Constitution require direct student approval during elections;

**WHEREAS,**

The current All Campus Constitution does not require the Assembly to set aside any specific amount of revenue to student organizations at the University of Michigan;

**WHEREAS,**

CSG should implement a student organization funding mandate in the All Campus Constitution that requires the Assembly to set aside funding to student organizations at the University of Michigan, protecting student organizations from any current or future political disputes.

## Section 2.

**THEREFORE it is, by the Students of the University of Michigan, through Central Student Government:**

**RESOLVED,**

This amendment is proposed to students in the November 2025 election with the following question, where the text “an amendment” will hyperlink to the text of Appendix A.

The CSG Assembly has requested your approval on an amendment to the All-Campus Constitution. This is what the proposed amendment would do:

1. Constitutionally mandate that at least 33% of all CSG Fall and Winter revenue and 20% of Spring/Summer revenue must be spent on student organization funding at the University of Michigan.

## Appendix A:

### **Constitution of the University of Michigan Ann Arbor Student Body**

#### **Article II The Central Legislature**

The Assembly has the power to levy dues and provide for their collection equally among the students. The Assembly must not raise the level of the fee above a maximum limit approved by a vote of the student body and the Regents. It appropriates all Central Student Government funds to student organizations and student programs and events as it deems appropriate. [At least 33% of all revenue from the Fall and Winter semesters, and 20% of revenue from the Spring/Summer semesters, shall be allocated to Student Organizations at the University of Michigan. This requirement can be suspended in the event of a genuine emergency, as determined by a ⅔ majority of the Assembly.](#) All funds collected in excess of the fee limit are placed in a University account created for the sole purpose of holding such funds, and must only be appropriated upon a referendum empowering the Central Student Government to appropriate such funds.
