

Guidelines for Submitting Article to BERITA SEDIMENTOLOGI

We would like to appreciate and thank you for considering to submit an article to **BERITA SEDIMENTOLOGI**. We welcome various types of articles such as research paper, review articles, short communications, discussions and replies, field trip reports and book reviews.

In order to speed up the review process and to maintain the quality of our publications, please follow the guidelines below:

1. Article should be submitted in English and there is no limitation on the length of the article.
2. Please use Times New Roman font, 12pt, justified, 1.5 spacing and a single column throughout your article.
3. The head of the article consists of Title, Author and the Author's institution. Please use capital letters for the Title and bold. For Author Name, please also use bold font. Please add 1 blank line between the title and the author. From the author's institution to the abstract title, please use double blank lines.
4. Abstract heading should be all capital and bold. The Abstract length is maximum 300 words. Please use 1 blank line before a new paragraph in the abstract.
5. Level 1 to Level 3 headings are shown the example (pp. 2-3). Please add 1 blank line before a new heading or a new paragraph throughout the article body. No blank line is necessary after new a heading and the first line in the paragraph.
6. When writing million years ago in the body text, please use Ma instead Mya. If you want to say a duration, for example 8 million years, then please use 8 my and not 8 Ma. To write a range, for example 16 to 10 million years ago, please use 16–10 Ma and not 16-10 Ma nor 16—10 Ma.
7. Figures should be mentioned in the text (in ascending order) and should be written as Figure 1 or quoted as (Figure 2), without abbreviation and not bold nor italic. Please provide Figure captures in a separate section, for example after the reference section.
8. Please submit us with high quality JPEG images of the figures, clearly numbered in the file names. If you are not able to provide us JPEG images, then pdf files are good enough although they are not ideal.
9. Cited references in the text follow the author and year system (Harvard Style), see example. Please ensure to re-check the reference list so that they are consistent with the body text.

ABSTRACT

Abstract should not be longer than 300 words and should not contain references. We suggest your abstract to contain a short version of introduction to the paper, research question, paper objectives, main method to solve the problem and main summary of the results. Abstract is not a re-write of any part of your main articles. It is not just a copy and paste of several paragraphs from your article and put them together in the abstract.

Please put 1 blank line spacing above every new paragraph of your abstract and continue with a left indent on the new sentences. After ending the abstract, please put 1 blank line before you type the keywords.

Keywords: please provide 3-5 keywords about your paper

INTRODUCTION

The first level heading such as Introduction is written by using the following font: Times New Roman, 12pt, bold. Figure should be written as Figure 1 and so on without abbreviation, in normal font (not bold nor italic). The Introduction section should include research question/problem statement, objectives of the paper, review of previous work (literature) and how this work is going to be different to previous work.

GEOLOGICAL SETTING

The second level heading should be written as above, using Times New Roman, 12pt, bold. The first letter of each word in the second heading should use capital letter, except for the words such as: of, and, to and from.

Cited references in the text should follow the author and year system (slightly modified Harvard Style). If the cited reference is written by a sole author, use: Wight (1994) or (Wight, 1994); for 2

authors: Wight and Budianto (2002) or (Posamentier and Allen, 1993); and for more than 2 authors: Hardjono et al. (2005) or (Hardjono et al., 2005). Examples of how to write the cited references (for the reference list) are given at the end of this guidelines.

The third level heading should be written in Times New Roman, 12pt, *italic* font and the first letter of each word in the heading uses a capital letter.

DATA AND METHODS

Data and methods section is essential to provide information about the amount of data and the workflow used in the research. Clear explanation about the methodology may also help the readers to repeat your research workflow in the future.

RESULTS AND INTERPRETATION

This section contains the results of your work and your analysis/interpretation. The name of this section is not necessarily as suggested above, you can also change the section title as applicable to your work and research topics. Some authors may want to add discussions into this part as well as part of the analysis.

CONCLUSIONS

This section is used for the conclusion or summary of your article. You can also call it Concluding Remarks if you don't want to put conclusion. We suggest that you don't just copy and paste any paragraph from your body text to write this section.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

It is advised to acknowledge the contribution of people who make it possible for you to complete the research and to write of your article but not included in the author list.
