FIRST ASSIGNMENT

MOTTO: The plan - "my desk"

- **1.** The objective of the first, one week long assignment is to observe ourselves and our thoughts and to serve as a basis for personal introduction in the class. The assignment consists of three parts:
- I. To observe and measure your own desk
- II. To highlight the most unique characteristic of the space marked out by the desk or the most important thought born out of observation
- III. To document the process with architectural tools
- **2.** The essence of the assignment is to introduce into methods of documentation and to represent exact technical data and abstract content at the same time. To seek a balance between objective and subjective content and represent them in a harmonic composition.
- **3.** All the **drawings** are to be submitted in a **custom made folder!**
- I. Technical drawings:
- 1 top view representing all the important objects **scale=1:5**
- 1 section or front/side view representing all the important objects scale=1:5
- 1 perspective or technical detail or another section
- **II. Subjective representation** (to be chosen from 3 options):

abstract drawing **or** subjective photo **or** 1500 characters long text/description

- III. Model: abstract object in optional form like a space composition model (maximum 2197 cm³ size)
- Sheet sizes to be chosen freely according to content, but maximum A3 [29.7x42.0cm]
- The subjective representation and the technical drawings should make one uniform representation
- The technique of the representation is to be chosen freely (graphite, coal, pastel, aquarell, lino-cut, etc.) but the necessary labels and markings should be part of the composition (name, date, title, scale, section marks, etc.)
- -The technique and material of the model is to be chosen freely. It is not a model of the desk but an abstract representation of the space marked out by the desk.
- **4. Submission and presentation** of the assignment is on the **17th February 2015** at class. **Late submission** (with a 20% reduction from the mark) is on the 24th February 2015.
