- Each student will be assigned the role of a conductor, speaker, or evaluator per session. These roles will be changed every meeting, so students will have the opportunity to participate in all aspects of Public Speaking.
  - **Conductors:** Conductors will be expected to "run" the session. Their job includes:
    - Introducing themselves
    - Introducing the speakers and evaluators of the week
    - Introducing the coach
    - Giving a joke of the day

- Closing the session

- **Speakers:** Speakers will be expected to give a 4-6 minute speech regarding one of the topics of the week.

**Evaluators:** Evaluators will be expected to give feedback on the speeches, offering constructive criticism with a focus on improving speaking habits.
