- 1. Welcome and introduction of guests
- 2. Co-chair
  - Gina has accepted the co-chair position.
- 3. Debrief assessment day
  - a. Evaluation results
  - Overall comments/feedback seem to be positive. Although only 22 people filled out the evaluation, there was a lot of positive feedback and engagement in the room on assessment day.
  - Having assessment day earlier in the week of in-service week was appreciated by faculty.
  - Continue to ensure the goal of assessment day activities is clear to faculty.
  - One suggestion is to communicate the importance of reflection from a practitioner perspective in this process (assessment, C&PR, etc.).
  - Possibly explore different ways to collaborate on assessment work within a department or other groups.
  - One idea is to look at different sections of the C&PR instrument and see which sections create opportunities for broader collaboration.
  - A question/idea came up: Could we take these last few ideas and do a brown-bag lunch with automatically applied PDUs, giving an opportunity for newer faculty to join in on discussions?

  - Wendy discussed logistics of the upcoming accreditation visit. The schedule has been set. Having as many people as possible from the committee attend the IAC

  - The need to reinvent the summer assessment institute was discussed, and some ideas were brought up:
    - One idea is to do a mini assessment institute by department, similar to the C&PR process.
    - Another idea is to have a more structured process for submitting artifacts in order to increase department participation in artifact submissions.
  - A suggestion was made to get two or three good examples of teamwork artifacts to share with faculty.
