What is a Mini-hub?

As we are progressing into the process of strengthening the Justice Hub, a common platform for everyone in the law and justice ecosystem to share, collaborate and build upon datasets enabling collaborative solutions that will bridge the problem of access to justice in India. We are working to align various communities to co-create and adopt data standards and help them open their data. We are seeing more demand for the domain-specific community that will move the data-sharing culture on that specific domain and reap the tangible outputs from it. Thus, we are keen to pilot the idea of creating mini-hubs within the Justice Hub to build a targeted community around some key sectors related to the law and justice ecosystem in India, like - Gender Justice, Child Rights, Digital Rights, Land Rights & Records and more.

What will it do? Goals of the Mini-hub

Some major goals for mini hubs are to:

- Identify key needs for a sector and communities around it
- Develop a common pool of resources (incl. data standards, reusable tools and more)
- Build a strong **network** of researchers, practitioners and more
- Develop a set of ethical and responsible use of data and tech practices
- Co-create concrete evidences



• Planning policy intervention to address the above needs
