what Board Game Club is an after-school gathering of students who enjoy games. They will have fun while building relationships and deepening friendships; learning patience, cooperation, and strategic thinking; and discovering games that are new to them while sharing and revisiting favorites.

They may bring their own board and card games, if they would like! These can be dropped off at the IMAGE classroom (Room 315) for safekeeping on the mornings of the days on which we meet. Games need to be preapproved by an adult before they are played.

Times: Board Game Club will meet on 10 (most) Wednesday afternoons from the holiday break through spring break, starting immediately after dismissal at 2:30 p.m., until 4:30 p.m. - 1/7/26, 1/14/26, 1/21/26, 1/28/26, 2/4/26, 2/11/26, 2/18/26, 2/25/26, 3/4/26, and 3/11/26. Students should arrive promptly so that games can be chosen and set up based on who is attending that day. Pickup will be at the main entrance at the front of the school.

Location: We will meet in Room 315 at Oakstown Intermediate.

Expectations: Participants are expected to follow the policies of the Oakestown Intermediate Handbook. Behavior referrals will result in suspension or permanent release from the Club, per teacher and principal decision. They will stay in Room 315 for the entire time that we meet unless prior arrangements are made for them to be picked up early. To show respect for fellow players, electronic devices should not be used at Board Game Club except to look up and clarify rules. It is important that arrangements are made for pick up promptly at 4:30. Space in Board Game Club is limited, and a waiting list might be created. If a student misses two consecutive weeks without notifying Mr. Anderson, he will first connect with the family, but then may offer their place to the next person on the waiting list.
