- **Citizen engagement** in data with a **rights-based approach**
- **Accountability & transparency** through data production and use
- **Inclusive monitoring** considering the situation of marginalised and minority groups
- **Leaving no one behind** in public planning

² **Suggestion for asks:**

- **Create collaboration mechanisms** with civil society to enable the sustainable production & use of Citizen Data
- **Support citizens** to sufficiently engage in data production and use for evidence-informed decision-making
- **Make use of Citizen Data** as complementary data source in monitoring and planning
- **Support capacity strengthening** of both civil society & govt agencies to foster accountability and inclusion
