Gallery, Comments & Senatorial Reports (30 min)

- Gallery Report: Azsanee Truss (Podfest); Afaf/Kairat (limited computer labs)
 - a. Afaf/Kairat petition to extend library hours and computers
 - b. Students have been leading the efforts and petitions toward increasing longer hours at computer labs
 - c. Hours in the lab were decreased, no prior announcements, kicked out at 7pm. 3 years ago, there were public computers on the 2nd floor, and some in the 1st floor.
 - d. Petition: demand increasing the library and computer labs. Signed by just over 20 students. Talk to Tom Rock and the computer department. Variety of student needs, some need extended hours for specific software. Students regardless of social class, should receive the services they need to succeed. Some of us need the computers to read.
 - e. The labs are under-advertised; handling should have been better. Lab on Macy 345, hours are inconsistent, no one knows the hours, it's cold.

- f. Comments from other students: they have tried to ask the library, limiting our right/access to the college. TC is gradually decreasing access. We deserve better services.
- g. Lights for study rooms on campus are dim and uncomfortable. Horace mann lab: spacious, more comfortable than others. We are asking for 2am hours extensions family + life means some students can't work til 9pm.
- h. Some students are afraid to go to outside resources, feeling unsafe walking down the street.
- i. Maria (advisor): did a 6 month study, 100 students come between
 11pm-2am. Cost to keeping it staffed versus the amount who use it was seen as feasible.
- j. Want for transparency regarding historical attempts made to extend library hours
- k. Vending machine for hot beverages.

- Advisor Reports: Tom, Maria
 - a. Maria: No events (cancelled or postponed) going on til after break due to cautions for Covid-19, til after spring break
 - b. Question: classes given in person, same process?
 - i. No. They are giving faculty options.
 - c. Questions: Members of student group: Is this going to extend to office hours; what determines what is a necessary event
 - i. Anything faculty or academic is still on, they may offer virtual/online office hours. Today, it is not impacting the classes and academics are essential.
 - ii. No word on interruption on classes or office hours. Other events and gatherings have been cancelled
 - d. Question: Students felt like community is something they want at a time like this, it's scary intimidating, double whammy on not meeting; Virtual community event
 - i. Health fee, they are doing virtual and in person support groups! A resource they have for students. We can look into virtual chat/cavas group/something place where students try to connect while we're going through this
 - e. Question: Attempt being made to share info
 - i. It's on the preparedness website, everything related to this event, On TC's and Columbia's health website. It's updated daily. Working on separate email with Alana to send to student
 - ii. This is not self isolation; this is cancelling events that are not essential.

 Doesn't mean that we can join together; organized non essential events are cancelled
 - f. Is TC taking any steps to address xenophobia/bias towards asian community?
 - i. Yes. Resources available to students, and sent out an email.
 - ii. Student advocate for the arts of columbia, Solidarity statement against xenophobia/bias
 - iii. Maybe there's something more we can do
 - g. GSC Graffiti, anti-Chinese on two buildings
 - i. Advisors (and some senators) were unaware of this. Will find out more from University Life office

 - e. Voted: approved!!

 - g. Will be posted for the TC community for 2 weeks before being official in the constitution.
- Sustainability Roundtable update (Karen)
 - a. TC-wide event: what TC students are doing in regards to sustainability, great seeing who was in the room. COnversation with all stakeholders, food services, hazardous waste, e waste, residential services, energy usage, all departments and did a short PPT. Great step toward transparency.
 - b. Residential services about general awareness, composting, food waste, and Ozzi box. Student orgs and OSA awareness as well.
