[08:53] Zinnia Zauber: The killer type just uses what tools are provided and wants to kill other users or enemy bots.

[08:53] Zinnia Zauber: The achiever type makes their focus to raise their level, gather points, or learn how to create.

[08:54] Zinnia Zauber: The explorer type's goal is to discover interesting things about where they are and share what they found.

[08:54] Zinnia Zauber: The socializer type is interested in building relationships between other users.

[08:54] Zinnia Zauber: There can be an evolution of a user or you can have several traits of the types. What kind of user type are you?

[08:54] Gentle Heron is definitely "socializer"

[08:54] Zinnia Zauber: yes

[08:55] Zinnia Zauber: Buffy you are an explorer I think.

[08:55] Tank Thibedeau (liltank.thibedeau): I am an acheiver with socializer tendencies

[08:55] Zinnia Zauber: It is an interesting way of looking at yourself.

[08:55] Zinnia Zauber: Because you are here to create awareness that hopefully will change or improve perspectives, motivation is an interesting aspect.

[09:06] Rhiannon Chatnoir: Today we have as our featured presenter Lyre Calliope who will be discussing how hackathons can be used to develop community partnerships and for social good.

[09:06] Dancers Yao: thanks always Zinnia

[09:07] Rhiannon Chatnoir: Bio: Lyre Calliope's mission is to assist in the emergence of a globally collaborative society. His first work experiences came as a volunteer for futures oriented non-profit organizations where he was exposed to cutting edge thought leadership, technology, and had his first experiences as a community organizer. Lyre began applying these experiences in 2006 through work as a social media consultant in an Atlanta-based agency called ConceptHub where he learned how business ecosystems operate and just how challenging they can be when faced with change. In 2010 he cofounded C4 Atlanta, a non-profit organization dedicated to stewarding Atlanta's creative economy by helping arts entrepreneurs build successful careers. Now in Boston, he's turned his efforts toward growing an ecosystem of open innovation practitioners that learn and build in the Commons.

[09:07] Gentle Heron applauds Lyre.

[09:07] Glitteractica Cookie: welcome back to the NPC Lyle!

[09:07] CarmenLittleFawn: Hi Lyre :-)

[09:07] Glitteractica Cookie: Lyre, I meant

[09:07] CarmenLittleFawn: Lyle*

[09:07] Lyre Calliope: Thanks for inviting me back Rhiannon!

[09:08] CarmenLittleFawn: hehehe

[09:08] Lyre Calliope: It's great to jump back inworld. :)

[09:08] Buffy Beale: yay Lyre!

[09:08] CarmenLittleFawn: nice to meet u Lyre

[09:08] Lyre Calliope: For some time I've been worried about how accelerating technological change also accelerates gaps within society: income, literacy, social equity, etc.

[09:08] Lyre Calliope: 'Disruptive innovation' is often seen as the most valuable form of innovation, but there has to be a place for constructive innovation.

[09:09] Vixus Snowpaw: ^

[09:09] Gentle Heron certainly hopes so!

[09:09] Lyre Calliope: There has to be a way in which innovation can occur that doesn't disrupt whole communities, industries, or even economies.

[09:09] Lyre Calliope: How do we approach innovation as an act of renovation?

[09:09] Lyre Calliope: I believe a major piece of this puzzle involves tying technological advancement to learning. This is exactly what happens at hackathons.

[09:09] Lyre Calliope: So, what is a hackathon?

[09:10] Lyre Calliope: A hackathon is an event in which people involved in software development come together to collaborate on projects. They usually last one to two days, but weeklong hackathons are not unknown.

[09:10] Lyre Calliope: The goals of hackathons can vary, but usually the aim is to develop working software. Hackathons usually have a theme such as a specific programming language, a product category, a community, an industry, or a problem space.

[09:10] Lyre Calliope: You can think of a hackathon as a programming marathon.

[09:11] Lyre Calliope: As the number of API (Application Programming Interface) based companies have grown, the number of hackathons has gone up as a means of marketing their developer focused products.

[09:11] Lyre Calliope: Some developers think there are too many hackathons. There's also the problem that good software takes time and few finished products ever come out of them.

[09:11] Lyre Calliope: As a result, hackathons are seen by many people as superficial. This is understandable when finished products are seen as the outcome.

[09:11] Lyre Calliope: The real value from hackathons comes not from software developed, but from learning: the new connections made neurally, socially, and webbily.

[09:12] InKenzo at Amoration (in.kenzo): It's a start but not a finish?

[09:12] Lyre Calliope: That's a real word btw, I checked in my head. ;)

[09:12] Glitteractica Cookie: in my new work with caravan studios, we will be looking into making more value out of what comes out of hackathons

[09:12] Glitteractica Cookie: more on that to come

[09:13] Lyre Calliope: Done right, hackathons enable communities of practice to form. Communities of open innovation practitioners.

[09:13] Lyre Calliope: Arthur C. Clarke famously said: "Any sufficiently advanced technology is indistinguishable from magic."

[09:13] Lyre Calliope: Well, hackthons are like the new Hogwarts. They're where you go to learn new magic.

[09:14] Lyre Calliope: So let's talk about purpose driven hackathons.

[09:14] Lyre Calliope: After Hurricane Sandy, I began volunteering for CrisisCommons, a non-profit organization that stewards the CrisisCamp hackathons it grew from.

[09:14] Lyre Calliope: CrisisCamps convene globally whenever there is a natural disaster to apply open source and open data capacities to disaster recovery efforts. More than just software developers, people of all stripes are invited to participate in data management tasks, communications, etc.

[09:15] Lyre Calliope: One of the lessons I've learned over the past few months is that unlike

traditional hackathons in which developers start working on projects from the very beginning, CrisisCamps require something of an R&D process.

[09:15] Lyre Calliope: The problems faced by crisis responders are unique, and often happen in real time. A successful CrisisCamp invites subject matter experts to share their knowledge and help guide the discovery process that informs the design and development of solutions.

[09:15] Lyre Calliope: At the end of a hackathon, it's customary for groups to demo the projects that they have been working on.. even if their projects are only prototypes or mockups.

[09:16] Lyre Calliope: During these demos, there's often an a-ha moment that comes when subject matter experts see what is technologically possible. This can open doors to new opportunities for change within the organizations these subject matter experts operate in.

[09:16] Lyre Calliope: The division of labor for a team at the typical hackathon falls between designers working on the user interface systems and developers working on the back-end logic systems.

[09:16] Lyre Calliope: For the purpose-driven hackathon, I'd like to add a third category of team participant: Storytellers facilitating problem discovery and solution documentation.

[09:17] Lyre Calliope: I imagine many of you hear actively identify as storytellers. :)

[09:17] Rhiannon Chatnoir nods

[09:17] Vixus Snowpaw: More like a multiplayer novel writer.

[09:17] Vixus Snowpaw smirks.

[09:17] Lyre Calliope: By introducing the storytelling role into the mix, hackathons can become a learning opportunity open to a much wider group of people.

[09:18] Lyre Calliope: There's a lot more that I'd love to say about the importance of storytelling in purpose-driven hackathons, but I should talk a bit about the role of data.

[09:18] Lyre Calliope: Innovation during the past decade can be largely attributed to the Open Source movement.

[09:18] CarmenLittleFawn: oh yes

[09:18] Lyre Calliope: Innovation during the next decade will be all about Open Data.

[09:19] Lyre Calliope: At the center of hackathon culture is the use of APIs: Application Programming Interfaces.

[09:19] Lyre Calliope: APIs enable the flow of data between Apps and organizational infrastructures in a secure, structured, and accessible way.

[09:20] Lyre Calliope: You may or may not realize it, but all of us are constantly using APIs every day. They are kind of like the web, but for all our apps.

[09:20] Lyre Calliope: 21st century organizational partnerships are built through the exchange of data via APIs.

[09:20] Lyre Calliope: I could easily have spent this entire time just talking about the role of APIs play in facilitating powerful partnerships between organizations, but then the community learning piece would have been lost!

[09:21] Lyre Calliope: One of the best ways to really understand APIs if you're not a techie is to go to a hackathon and help put them into action!

[09:21] Lyre Calliope: Making is learning, and we learn best when we make together.

[09:21] Lyre Calliope: The last thing the world needs is more Instagrams and Pinterests.

Unfortunately, software developers are too often isolated from communities with real problems

to solve.

[09:22] CarmenLittleFawn: mmhmm

[09:24] Rhiannon Chatnoir: links are good and any details or questions that anyone has?

[09:24] Lyre Calliope: So, questions? :)

[09:25] CarmenLittleFawn: how can a story teller get involved?

[09:25] Jen (jenelle.levenque): QUESTION: How do we find out about hackathons and what their focus is?

[09:26] Lyre Calliope: First thing that brings real value: documentation. Most software developers hate creating documentation, but it's really important for encoding knowledge as well as engaging others in building forward.

[09:26] Jen (jenelle.levenque): Made my living as translator between engineering and users

[09:27] Lyre Calliope: Second, facilitating conversation and understanding with subject matter experts and helping developers think through application logic.

[09:27] Glitteractica Cookie: there are thousands of hackathons going on, so I doubt there is one master list

[09:27] Ozma Malibu: so the storyteller can interpret the problems to the designers and developers, and the storyteller can have the vision of a solution that holds everything together (yes Jen - I made my living similarly as translator but in education)

[09:27] Lyre Calliope: Btw, when I say subject matter experts, I mean people with pain points within communities.

[09:28] Glitteractica Cookie: my new work with Carvansyudios will be largely focused on hackthons and apps that come out of them

[09:28] CarmenLittleFawn: yes I know Lyre

[09:28] Glitteractica Cookie: Lyre and the rest of you... you may be interested in this hacker helper wiki: <http://hackerhelper.wikispaces.com> which identifies the probelms and gives corresponding data to hackers who build apps to help solve civis problems

[09:28] Lyre Calliope: As for where to find out about hackathons, there are community calendars you can find. A friend of mine is trying to compile a semi-master list and I'll share that link.

[09:29] Lyre Calliope: Honestly, I'd try Meetup.com!

[09:29] Glitteractica Cookie: @caravanstudios is our twitter handle

[09:29] Ozma Malibu: pain points! I had not heard that expression. very useful way to see the problem.

[09:29] CarmenLittleFawn: that is good Glitter

[09:29] CarmenLittleFawn: and understandable Ozma

[09:29] Lyre Calliope: Enter the social stream where developers reside and ask them where the hackathon calanders are. :)

[09:29] Lyre Calliope: Glitter: that sounds exciting. :)

[09:30] Rhiannon Chatnoir: I have a question, how could you seem something like a Hackathon being carried out within a virtual space such as Second Life or otherwise, and within communities like NPC

[09:30] Glitteractica Cookie: we are hoping ppl add to the hacker helper wiki and edit it if they see fit

[09:31] Lyre Calliope: So, the great thing about open source tools is that they allow for productive time and space displacement.

[09:31] Glitteractica Cookie: I've talked to Courghran Mayo about that idea Rhiannon

[09:31] Lyre Calliope: Which makes them even more powerful when you get people together at the same time.

[09:32] Lyre Calliope: As long as you get people together within the same headspace and have effective communication channels in place, you're good to go.

[09:32] Lyre Calliope: Horror story:

[09:33] Rhiannon Chatnoir: so collaborative presence is key - even if virtual

[09:33] Lyre Calliope: After Hurricane Sandy, I was at the MIT Media Lab at the local CrisisCamp while at least a dozen other hackathons were ongoing around the world.

[09:33] Lyre Calliope: All sharing waaaaayyyy too many communications channels.

[09:33] Lyre Calliope: It didn't just disrupt our ability to work with other events, it disrupted our room.

[09:33] Frans Charming: You know some the relief fundraising we did and do in SL can be viewed as a hackaton. Thinking back on the once I was involved in, though less about providing data/program

[09:34] Lyre Calliope: The physical space was disrupted by too much virtual distraction.

[09:34] Jen (jenelle.levenque): The key word with communications was EFFECTIVE

[09:35] Lyre Calliope: So yes. Collaborative presence. :)

[09:35] Lyre Calliope: And by past experience, hacking in second life is second only to actual physical presence.

[09:36] Jen (jenelle.levenque): And a lot cheaper

[09:36] Gentle Heron: Ironically, the latest Quick Tips from Second Life is about connecting with communities:

[09:39] Lyre Calliope: And helps form that core engaged community that supports itself.

[09:39] Lyre Calliope: Kind of like what used to happen in the old days of yore right here.

[09:40] Rhiannon Chatnoir: any other questions for Lyre on Hackathons or how this could fit witing your org/mission

[09:40] CarmenLittleFawn: that would be nice

[09:40] Rhiannon Chatnoir: yes Lyre

[09:40] Lyre Calliope: One other comment!

[09:40] Vixus Snowpaw: I hate to interject, but there seems to be a griever in my sim.

[09:41] Lyre Calliope: I'm a big fan of inter-organizational collaboration. Communities exist between organizations.

[09:41] CarmenLittleFawn: oh no

[09:41] Rhiannon Chatnoir: feel free to run off, we will be here still for a bit Vixus

[09:41] Lyre Calliope: Hackathons are a great way to bring multiple organizations together and learning how their communities not only intersect, but can help facilitate organizational partnerships out in the open.

[09:42] CarmenLittleFawn: I would be interested in seeing how it would fit my organization

[09:42] Lyre Calliope: Like I said, it's like Hogwarts!
