

**SILLIMAN.** Frederick H. Silliman, 71, of 37 Prospect Hill Road, Windsor, died Sunday (Dec. 18) at Hartford Hospital. Born in Hartford he was a lifelong Windsor resident. A graduate of the Loomis Institute, he worked for the former Hartford Connecticut Trust Co. until entering the Army at the outset of World War II. He served in the Army and the Air Force with military intelligence in both World War II and Korea. He was an advisor on staff to General Eisenhower and received the Bronze Star before retiring as a major in 1955. He was employed by the Town of Windsor Highway Department, retiring in 1975. Mr. Silliman was a member of the Poquonock Community Church and a former member of the church choir and the Poquonock Fire Company. He leaves his wife, Marjorie (Bartlett) Silliman; four sons and their wives, John T. and Debby Silliman, Jeffrey W. and Dianne Silliman, Robert W. and Laurie Silliman all of Windsor, and James B. Silliman of Paul Smiths, N.Y.; two brothers, Robert T. Silliman and Dr. Warren B. Silliman both of Windsor; and seven grandchildren, John Jr., Thomas, Kate, Nicole, Robert Jr., Nathaniel and Caryn. The funeral will be Wednesday, 11 a.m., at the Carmon-Poquonock Funeral Home, 1816 Poquonock Ave., Poquonock section of Windsor. The Rev. James Silver will officiate.
