Transcribe Interview Q & A

Troy Rose:

Ok, I'm Troy Rose and I'm here with Cole Johnson and my first question for Cole is, what drove you to really gravitate towards sports?

Cole Johnson:

So growing up I guess, I mean, one of the first things I can remember other than just watching, I was a big Disney movie fan for a while and I might watch that with my mom but the other thing really, that I fell towards early on in my life was a ball. Troy Rose:

I wish I was here for four years to build that resume; I still did some resume building back in my undergrad but not as much as I get here. So, in one year, I would, I want to do as much as possible, juggle everything I can to get myself prepared for the field so in three to five years. I mean I came in here play-by-play, but I want to be able to know how to report a story, I want to know how to produce a story. I feel like in three to five years I want to be able to have a lot of different backgrounds so I can use that in several different jobs. Obviously in the first few years I'm going to start off with a lower level job, but just kind use that, use my ability of being very versatile to hopefully get me a bigger job down the road.

Cole Johnson:

No, that's it, I guess. Syracuse has been where I wanted to go entire life. I grew up close to here, I put all my marbles in to one basket to go here and it worked out and I'm very glad to be here and I hope it works out.
