ASAA Zone Report – Spring Meetings 2023 Championships 2022/23

- All Championships were held on their "normal" dates with a full complement of teams! (Well, Wrestling had to be moved later because of an issue obtaining officials.) Things we didn't used to take for granted. Sportsmanship Winners banners, pins, keychains
- Congratulations to all teams and individual athletes and coaches who have won the first Set The Bar sportsmanship awards this year. The new Set the Bar keychains are in and were handed out at Cheerleading Championships; these are to replace the pins but we will continue to hand out the pins as well until we are out. Track & Field
- ASAA has entered a partnership with MileSplit, a company that handles registrations for Track & Field and Cross-Country Running. You will likely have received confirmation of this by the time of your zone meeting.
- You must still register your students in SRS (recommended sooner than later so your school can be verified with MileSplit) but will have to enter students in your zone championship using the MileSplit website. Note: Hytek Team Manager and TrackieReg are no longer being used. Coaching We will finish rewriting the Bylaws and Policy course after the AGM; there are a number of NOMs that could change some vital content to this course. Reminder:
- Safe Sport Training one team official (head coach, assistant coach, teacher sponsor, or other) on every team must complete the course by the end of the 2022/23 school year. To review a coach's NCCP transcript, you can use the coach transcript feature of the CAC website to ensure they are compliant with all coaching requirements. Sponsorship
- For the past six months the ASAA has been in negotiations with a company to take over sponsorship acquisition for the ASAA. There is a guaranteed return that exceeds our current sponsor income, plus additional benefits including enhancements to our website development. The ASAA Board will be given details they require to support this initiative and member schools will be informed when the agreement is signed. Website
- The ASAA office staff is REALLY looking forward to the new SRS being ready for August 2023. In May & June, we will be having some ADs help us with some trial runs etc.; if you are interested, email Amanda at info@asaa.ca. Starting in August, asaa.ca will no longer host our Championship sites; it will essentially only be for ADs and principals.
- We will be launching a public-facing website for students, parents, coaches etc. called SchoolSportAlberta.ca in the fall (with sponsorship assistance as noted in the bulleted item above). It will be based on the model of a few State Associations; here is one example. It will take some time for us to build our website into something as informative as this (i.e. banners with all the recent scores, video links, articles etc.) but we are very excited about the potential of this project. - Joint School Teams: You need to complete a joint school team request every time you plan on joining with another school team to form a team. Your zone and the ASAA Compliance Officer will need to approve the joint school team.
- Traveling or have visiting teams from out of province? If traveling out or province to an event involving three or more schools you need to complete a request to travel form. If you are hosting out of province teams that are not covered by blanket sanctions (see pages 35-36) you must complete a sanction form. Strategic Plan
- The ASAA Executive regularly visits the Strategic plan to see how we are doing. They will provide an update to the ASAA Board of Governors at the AGM. Live Streaming
- ASAA will be moving back to a paid platform for access to provincials from 2023/24 onwards. We are currently preparing a "Request for Proposals" which will be sent to several companies with a goal to have a provider in place before the end of the current school year. Policy Development

What's new?

New sportsmanship committee

- Created to help spread sportsmanship initiatives in every zone and not have it rely on just one person (Heather Bartling)
- Broken up into 3 subcommittees to tackle 3 projects the sportsmanship committee wanted done.
- Slogan: Set the Bar ->setting the bar for what sportsmanship is to look like



New sportsmanship initiatives

Set the Bar schools program

- Schools sign up at the beginning of the year to be identified as a Set the Bar school (optional)
 - Get a digital seal for every year they participate to put on their school website. Schools can purchase a banner to be put in their gym.(Banner is optional)
 - Schools will also be recognized as a Set the Bar school on the ASAA website and the ASAA yearbook every year that they are a part of the program.
 - Should include a Set the Bar school on their school website
- Implement or maintain 5 initiatives from a list that is already generated. Every year that you take part, try to introduce another new initiative.
- The focus for the initiatives is not just on the athletes and coaches, but on the spectators and teachers too.
- For schools to be held accountable they will have to submit slides to ASAA showcasing sportsmanship initiatives that are being done in their school. A slideshow, by the ASAA, will be put together to showcase all of the initiatives that are being done throughout Alberta.

Sportsmanship Cards

• Before every game, every school will have a sportsmanship card that is to be read out. Sportsmanship should be seen through players, coaches, officials, volunteers, and spectators. See picture below for the sportsmanship cards.

Set the Bar Role Models

- ASAA recognizes individuals that have exemplified Setting the Bar in sportsmanship.
 - Anybody can nominate an individual through a Google form. Individuals will get: social media recognition, a Set the Bar t-shirt, and Sportsmanship pin.

Revamp of Provincial Sportsmanship banner nominations

- Rubric that is to be filled out by coaches, captains, scorekeepers, officials, and the host/hosting committee
- The rubric is to accurately evaluate teams on how they did during the game.
 - o 5 being outstanding and exceeding sportsmanship expectations
 - o 3 being a normal game with nothing that stood out
 - o 1 being questionable and disrespectful on the court/field
- Rubrics may or may not be filled in with teams that you will be playing.
- Rubrics will be included in the coaches package
- Meeting with the coaches and captains to discuss the importance of doing these rubrics. Gives captains a bit more of an important role at Provincials
- When done with the rubric, hand it to the hosting school before you leave or send it to ASAA (Heather Bartling) if you forget to hand it in
- 2 different rubrics->one for team sports (volleyball, basketball, football, rugby, team handball) and one for curling

Revamp of Provincial Sportsmanship pins

- Transitioning from a pin to a keychain->will give away pins first before the keychains are implemented
- Pin/keychain comes with a card. You are to fill it out with the individuals name, jersey number, school and sport. The card is to be sent to ASAA and the pin/keychain is given to the recipient during either an award ceremony or a break in gameplay.
- Small committee is in charge of looking out for individuals that exemplify Setting the Bar->not to be given out easily though. We want them to have meaning.

- Organizers:must submit information of recipients & rationales at the end of the tournament
