



## Organization of a scientific event in Montpellier

Science-society dialogues in the construction of knowledge on agroecology: experiences from Argentina and France

TUE April 18, 2023

WED April 19, 2023

This event will bring together scientists and agricultural producers from France and Argentina to jointly reflect on the construction of knowledge for agroecological transitions. The intention is to nurture, with grounded theoretical and methodological debates, concrete experiences of participatory research. The discussions will focus notably on Participatory Guarantee Systems (PGS), which are local mechanisms for assessing quality standards for agro-ecological production, based on the active participation of producers, consumers and state, educational and scientific institutions. This event will feed subsequent science-society exchanges for boosting agroecological transitions through participatory approaches.

Delina Puma is a producer of Bolivian origin who has been working in the horticultural belt of Greater La Plata (province of Buenos Aires, the most important in Argentina) since 2010. She belongs to the Land Workers Union (UTT), where she got training in agroecology. In turn, for the last five years, she has been training other members of her organisation (in La Plata and at the national level) using the "Campesino a Campesino" methodology. With the People's Technical Consultancy (CoTePo) of the UTT, they have trained more than 100 technicians in agroecology. Until the beginning of 2023, she was part of the organisation's Production Secretariat, where she collaborated with the launch of biofactories and plant nurseries and the sale and production of seeds.

With Yves, we have been cultivating gardens within the framework of Organic Agriculture since 1974. Between the river and forest, 80 km from Montpellier in France, we select vegetable "peasant seeds" and have joined the Réseau Semences Paysannes, in line with the ethics of the Common.

An account of our research between farmers was published by Yves "De l'oignon de Tarassac, semences paysannes", after which I wanted to put words and rigour on what we were observing in the fields in connection with researchers in institutions (INRAE, CIRAD) through the co-construction of collaborative research. I am passionate about the issue of symbioses (endomycorrhizae). So is the North-South link.

 <u>Luis Caballero</u>, economist, Argentine Institute of Agricultural Technology (INTA)





Since 1999 he has worked in programmes and projects of different public institutions in Argentina, such as the Ministry of Social Development, the Secretariat of Family Agriculture (MAGyP) and the National Institute of Agricultural Technology (INTA), on issues of rural development, cooperatives, social and popular economy, family farming, agroecology and food sovereignty. He joined INTA in 2006 and currently works as Manager of its Inter-institutional Articulation and Extension Services.

<u>Eric Scopel, researcher, UR AÏDA & coordinator of CIRAD agroecological research</u>



Dr Eric Scopel was Director of the AÏDA (Agroecology and Sustainable Intensification of Annual Crops) research unit at CIRAD between 2013 and 2019. He is now in charge of the coordination of agroecological research at CIRAD. He has been working for more than 25 years on the study and development of new cropping systems based on conservation agriculture and biodiversification principles for rainfed tropical crops. He has characterised their impacts on the sustainability of agricultural production and the efficiency of natural resource use and protection. More specifically, he has

He has specifically focused on water, carbon and nitrogen dynamics through experimental and modelling approaches. He has solid experience in different ecologies of tropical countries, mainly in Latin America (Mexico, Central America until 2000 and Brazil from 2000 to 2009) and more recently in Africa.

He worked in Madagascar (from 2009 to 2013), where he participated in several projects on the impacts of cover crops on agroecosystem eco-environmental services. He has recently developed research on participatory design and adaptation of innovative cropping systems and on supporting agroecological transitions with smallholder farmers in several countries.

She is an agronomist and lecturer in the Rural Extension Department of the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences at the National University of Córdoba. Since 2014, in the framework of university extension projects and together with other institutions such as the National Secretariat of Family Agriculture, INTA and social organisations, she has participated in creating the Participatory Guarantee System of the Agroecological Fair of Córdoba. Furthermore, she is a member of the Peri-urban and Agroecology Team, an inter-institutional and transdisciplinary team comprised of researchers and extensionists from the State. This team focuses on the co-construction of knowledge from the paradigm of agroecology, applying participatory methodologies for developing participatory research-action processes and using transition evaluation tools such as TAPE. In addition, she is part of the National Directorate of Agroecology team, in which she coordinates the line of work on Participatory Guarantee Systems (PGS, or SPG in Spanish and French).
