Additional Virginia scholarships

Esperanza Education Fund

- **Eligibility:** Applicants must be born outside the U.S. or have two parents born outside the U.S. Applicants must be either a graduating senior at a high school in the District of Columbia, Maryland, or Virginia or a recent GED grad residing in DC, Maryland or Virginia
- **Amount:** \$5000 to \$20,000, depending on financial need
- **Deadline:** June 1

Virginia Museum of Fine Arts Fellowship Program

- **Eligibility:** Citizens or permanent residents of the United States, as well as current legal residents of Virginia (and have been so for at least 12 consecutive months prior to the application) deadline.
- **Amount:** \$8,000
- **Deadline:** November 6

Virginia Tuition Assistance Grant*****

Established in 1972, the Tuition Assistance Grant Program (VTAG) is designed to assist Virginia residents who attend accredited private, nonprofit colleges and universities in Virginia, excluding religious training or theological education. The grants are renewable, with an average award of \$3,400 per year for undergraduates and \$1,700 for graduate students.
