Charge

The Coalition of Open Access Policy Institutions (COAPI) is committed to sharing information and resources to assist in the development and implementation of institutional Open Access (OA) policies. The Copyright Working Group (CWG) supports this goal by gathering questions, hosting conversations, and collecting and sharing resources for COAPI members to share with fellow members and the public. The Copyright Working Group is charged with identifying and addressing (with resources, templates, best practices, and community calls) common copyright-related questions and challenges that arise over the course of OA policy development and implementation in collaboration with the COAPI Steering Committee.

Responsibilities

1. Identify (and solicit) common OAP-related copyright questions
2. Gather established and develop new resources on relevant copyright-related topics in various mediums
3. Gather established and develop new templates and language (e.g., FAQs, infographics) that help address common copyright- and licensing-related concerns that arise in OAP development and implementation
4. Share the collected information in the COAPI Toolkit, gather feedback, and assess and update this content as needed
5. Offer copyright-related Community Calls: develop, market, facilitate, document, and assess these efforts
6. Provide a brief report to the Steering Committee every June on activities and feedback

Membership

1. The working group should include 3-5 members, each serving a 2-year term

2. COAPI members of all membership levels are welcome to serve on the working group
3. Membership may be reassessed after the first two years

Goals

1. Gather questions and develop resources (e.g., FAQs, infographics, Community Calls)
2. Facilitate at least one community call every six months
3. Work with the Steering Committee to gather feedback through surveys
4. Onboard two new members in 2021
