Across Generations: Two-Spirit Leadership, Health, and Healing

Beverly LittleThunder: renowned community elder, helped coin the term

Two-Spirit; worked as a nurse throughout Native country, shunned, worked all through the AIDS epidemic in NYC (racism within LGBTQ+ community, coming back around to hold all of her identities in her work today)

Benefit to Harvard: a living library; represents many of the intersections that are received as separate here; can speak to movement longevity alongside tensions (between generations, tradition, genders)
