## Peninsula High School's TideHawks NNDCC Unit Elevated to Fully Funded NJROTC Status by Department of the Navy

Gig Harbor, WA – Peninsula School District is proud to announce a significant advancement for the Navy National Defense Cadet Corps (NNDCC) unit at Peninsula High School, known as the TideHawks. The Department of the Navy has officially recognized the TideHawks as a Navy Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (NJROTC) unit, granting it full funding and substantial support.
