- Fundraising ideas to discuss.
 - o Purdy's (already approved) is ready to go near the end of November.
 - o Fundraising Bricks Terence, they can be engraved with what you want, people buy them for graduates, in memory or someone, teams, families, retiring teachers etc. Creates a lasting memory/tie to the school. The company is located in Ontario, they offer the bricks and the engraving. The more you buy, the lower the cost. Fixed \$700 shipping charge for the pallet. That's the big risk. If we sell 500 @ \$35 it would generate \$10,000. If we only sell 100 at \$23, we would only break even. Suggestions: survey for interest, possibly someone who can bring them back on a truck, details on plans on where/how the bricks can be used around the school (Mr. Power to work on this).
