The abstract should be written in the language that the paper will be presented in the conference (English, Malay or Arabic). The abstract should contain brief descriptions of the research purpose/s, method/s, relevant finding/s as well as conclusion or implications of the study. The length of the abstract should be between 250-300 words.

Keywords: Not more than 5 keywords indicating the field, sub-field and/or topic areas [Arial 11-point, italic, justified alignment].
