





CONDUCT OF PLAY

1. RULES OF GOLF

The Luista Junior Golf Championship shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as adopted by the R&A Rules Limited and any Local Rules as approved by the Tournament Committee.

2. **ELIGIBILITY**

Participation in this event shall be limited to invited junior golfers who have not reached the age of 19 on the day of the competition.

- Class A Open to boys and girls who are not yet 19 as of August 18, 2024.
- Class B Open to boys and girls who are not yet 15 as of August 18, 2024.
- Class C Open to boys and girls who are not yet 13 as of August 18, 2024.
- Class D Open to boys and girls who are not yet 11 as of August 18, 2024.
- Class E Open to boys and girls who are not yet 9 as of August 18, 2024.

3. TOURNAMENT FORMAT

The Luista Junior Golf Championship will be individual stroke play 54 holes for players 13-18 years old and 36 holes for players 8U-12 years old.

Class A & B (WAGR)

August 17 - First and Second Round - 36 holes

August 18 - Final Round - 18 holes

Class C, D & E:

August 17 - First Round - 18 holes

August 18 - Final Round - 18 holes

54-hole individual stroke play for Class A and B (ages 13-18). *Must hole out.* 36-hole individual stroke play for Class C-E (ages 8U-12). *Max score per hole is double par.*

4. AWARDS

Awards will be given to the top 5 for each division.

Awarding will take place at the clubhouse following the conclusion of the tournament.

5. **ENTRY FEE:**

36 holes: 3,500 (Class C, D, E) 54 holes: 4,500 (Class A, B)







6. **TEE TIMES**

7. CLASSIFICATION AND TEE MOUNDS

8. CARTS AND CADDIES

Caddie fee - ₱700

Personal caddies are allowed only for 8 years old and under but players still have to pay for the caddie on deck.

No caddies on the green for 9 years old and above.

Cart fee - ₱800 (member) / ₱1000 (non member)

Only Class C-E will be allowed to use carts.

9. **DISTANCE-MEASURING DEVICES**

A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures **distance only**. The use of a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect a player's play, such as gradient or wind speed is not permitted. *Penalty for breach:* Disqualification

10. RECORDING OF SCORES

Each player will be assigned as "marker" to record the score of another player in the same group. The marker shall be responsible for recording the player's correct score after each hole. After completion of the round the player shall:

- a) Check his/ her hole-by-hole score for accuracy.
- b) Settle any doubtful points with the Committee.







- c) Ensure that his/ her marker has signed his/ her card.
- d) Countersign the card him/ herself.

11. SUBMISSION OF SCORECARDS

Scorecards must be signed at the scoring table in the clubhouse within 15 minutes after the player holes out from their last hole. The scorecard is deemed officially submitted once the player has left the scoring table.

12. **DECISION OF TIES**

- a. In the event of a tie (multiple ties) for the Champion of each division, the winner shall be decided via hole-by-hole "sudden death" play-off, until a winner is determined. The play-off hole/s will be decided by the Tournament Director on the final day of the event.
- b. If a sudden death play-off is not possible due to darkness, time constraints or bad weather, the Tournament Director may proceed to a shoot-out skills challenge to determine the winner. Details of this skills challenge shall be announced when the need arises.
- c. All other ties will be decided by count back. The count back procedure to be used will be as follows: a. Last nine holes (10 to 18) b. last six holes (13 to 18) c. last three holes (16 to 18)
- d. then hole by hole starting from the last hole (18, 17, 16...) e. If there is still no result then the winner shall be decided by the toss of a coin.

13. PACE OF PLAY

Players are expected to maintain a reasonable pace of play throughout the round. Slow play may result in penalties as determined by the tournament committee.

14. **CODE OF CONDUCT**

Players are expected to adhere to the highest standards of sportsmanship and etiquette. Any form of cheating, unsportsmanlike conduct, or violation of the rules may result in disqualification. Respect for fellow competitors, officials, and the golf course is paramount.

15. **COMPLIANCE WITH WAGR GUIDELINES**

The tournament will adhere to the guidelines and requirements set forth by the World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR) for inclusion and recognition of results. All necessary information and documentation will be submitted to WAGR in a timely manner following the conclusion of the tournament.

16. **CANCELLATION/WITHDRAWAL POLICY**







A player can withdraw during a round only because of injury or other disability requiring medical attention or serious personal emergency. Once a round is completed and his scorecard is signed, a player cannot withdraw for any reason and without explanation.

Refunds will not be granted for cancellations and withdrawals after the tournament registration deadline.

17. TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE / OFFICIALS

The Tournament Committee / Officials will be responsible for the administration of the competition and reserves the right to amend the Conditions of Play before the start of the tournament. Revisions will be posted on the player information board. Disputes, if any, will be settled by the Tournament officials, headed by the tournament director, whose decisions shall be final. The competition shall be deemed closed when the Championship trophy has been presented.
