What happens next? The communications group will contact you with questions, if any.

You'll receive a draft (galley proof) with a request for your corrections.

Once you send it back with your corrections, we'll make those corrections.

Then you'll see a final galley proof for a last check for any glaring errors.

Once you send that back with your OK, we'll get it ready for the printer (or equivalent).

You'll see one printer's proof (or equivalent) – this is the *last chance* for corrections. Only really serious corrections are accepted at this stage, since correcting printer's proofs costs money. Once you OK the proof, your product will be sent for production.
