Unit Title

Disasters Impacting the Community

Unit Summary

This unit will cover how disasters cause change, how natural disasters affect our world, and how disasters have changed history. Students will learn about how organisms undergo life changes to help them survive, how the earth is constantly changing, how scarcity impacts a community, and much more. - (B) explore that some characteristics of organisms are inherited such as the number of limbs on an animal or flower color and recognize that some behaviors are learned in response to living in a certain environment such as animals using tools to get food.
