PTA Business:

Playground Committee Presentation

- Would like to partner with PTA wherein PTA is a sponsor because playground committee is not a 501(c)(3) organization;
- Current focus is a covered area over basketball court; 60x90 feet; similar to what is in place at Laurelhurst;
- During fundraiser, asked community members to vote on different proposals, such as new playground equipment, turf on the field, and other ideas; covered basketball court attained highest support (by far);
- Committee has submitted a project development request through the district (must get permission from district to move forward);
- Presented timeline: if all steps are successful, construction would occur in summer 2027;
- Committee is not seeking money from PTA;
- Committee is requesting that PTA act as a fiscal sponsor entity that signs for grants, accept donations, and hold money; requesting committee and PTA sign on to a memorandum of understanding (MOU) memorializing that agreement;
- Current MOU proposal includes provision that if project is not successful, money raised would revert to PTA general fund;

FY 25/26 Budget Presentation and Vote

- Major changes from current budget to next year's budget:
 - Added a sustaining donation line for people who want to set up a regular monthly donation;
 - Increased money/student for each classroom from \$30/student to \$45/student for k-2 and from \$25/student to \$40/student for 3-8
 - Removed some items (STEAM night funds, sensory room) because those funds were not being spent
 and because funds/student for each classroom went up; each classroom has more control over the
 money PTA allocates;
 - Decreased some discretionary funding because next year or two might be leaner fundraising years;
 - o Increased Sun School from \$10k to \$12k
 - Did include a playground fund line item, but it is just a placeholder until MOU is approved and how PTA helps committee is figured out;
- Pres tabbed secretary as facilitator to participate in conversation; suggested changing section B line items to generic line items to allow next year's board freedom to host the fundraising events it wants to host;
- Katie Kenton moved to approve budget with that change; Jen Naas seconded:
 - Voting members present approved budget with amendment to section B discussed above;

- There are additional positions that are vacant that could be filled, but are not required: PYP liaison and MYP liaison; there are also affinity group liaisons that sit on the board, but they are not voted upon by PTA; they are appointed by the affinity groups;
- Board voted upon and approved by voting members present;

Admin Updates:

- Field Day: June 5; Sojourn is volunteering again;
- There will be a clap out for Mr. Massie; probably occur during 8th Grade promotion and clap out;
- June 10: 8th Grade promotion and clap out;
- Through bond, Vernon expects cameras;
 - As a side, Mr. Keefer has been at school for 15 years and has not seen much property damage, but this
 year windows have been broken 30 times; cameras will help with that; Mr. Keefer believes the events
 have been vandalism, not aggression;
- Vernon can expect renovations in future bonds, but it will be a while;
- Continuing to advocate for more staffing;
- June 3: Middle School info night;
- District has come to school to do climate walks; Mr. Keefer is advocating for culturally responsive mentors, like they have at Ockley Green and other schools;
- Mr. Keefer said school will have an assistant principal that will be present next year;

- PAT hosting listening events; one at Vernon on May 29, starting at 5; other events are at June 2 and June 10, but in other parts of Portland
- Volunteer for owl fest!!
