Date – 07-11-2025

Objective of the Program – To commemorate the 150 years of Vande Mataram

Context of the Programme: The Government of India has decided to commemorate 150 years of 'Vande Mataram' as nationwide, yearlong celebrations to mark 150th anniversary of the National Song 'Vande Mataram'. The Song was written by Bankim Chandra Chatterjee, is believed to have been written during the auspicious occasion of 'Akshaya Navami' on 7th November 1875. In recognition of its historic importance and national significance the Government of India has decided to commemorate this milestone with activities across the country from 7th November 2025 to 7th November 2026.

In this connection APCCE guided to all the GDC's to celebrate this yearlong programme in the colleges.

Vande Mataram is being celebrated for 150 years in India because it was composed in 1875 by Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay and has played a significant role in the country's freedom struggle. The song, which invokes the Motherland as a symbol of strength, prosperity, and divinity, became a rallying cry for freedom fighters and a symbol of national pride.

The celebration, which began on November 7, 2025, marks a milestone in India's civilizational journey and is being observed with various events across the country. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the year-long

commemoration, releasing a commemorative stamp and coin, and launching a portal where citizens can upload their videos of singing the national song.

The Union Cabinet has approved nationwide celebrations to honor the song's 150th anniversary, highlighting its significance in India's independence movement and cultural heritage. The celebrations aim to promote national unity, pride, and awareness about the song's history and importance.

Description of the Programme: APCCE, Mangalagiri directed this yearlong programme in 4 phases from 7th November 2025 to 7th November 2026. Phase-I 7-14 November 2025, Phase-2 Jan 19-26, Phase-3 Aug 7-15, and Phase-4 Nov 1-7.

So, the department of Political Science conducted Mass Singing of Vande Mataram in the college premises at 10.00 AM along with staff and students on November 7th 2025 as a part in Phase I programme.
