

HPPS Uniform Policy

At Headley Park, we believe that school uniform gives each child and our school community a sense of identity and encourages pride in our school. School uniform is compulsory at Headley Park Primary School.

The principal colour at Headley Park is red (worn with dark grey/black and white). The uniform expectation is the same for all children.

As part of the home school agreement parents and carers sign at the start of each academic year, parents and carers are asked to agree to uphold the uniform policy and ensure children always come to school in full school uniform. The school will enforce the policy if children are not wearing the correct uniform. However, we will not sanction children for incorrect uniforms.

Where children are not wearing the correct uniform:

- Parents/carers will be contacted to remind them of the expectations
- Spare uniform items will be provided for the child to change into, if available

If there is a reason for a child not to wear the full uniform, a message from home must be provided. This could be via email to the class teacher.

All items of clothing, footwear and bags must be clearly labelled with your child's name and class.

This will enable lost items to be returned to the correct child. The school accepts no responsibility for lost or damaged items of uniform.

Embroidering items of clothing with the new logo

We are mindful of the financial impact on our families of purchasing school uniforms and we are committed to securing the most cost effective way to support our families. Therefore, we have taken the decision that having a logo on items of school uniform is not mandatory. As such you can decide whether you wish to purchase items of plain uniform (from places such as supermarkets) and then embroider these items with our logo.

Standard uniform, Nursery to Year 6

Hair/Headwear
Long hair should be tied back. Any headbands etc. must be plain red, white or the colour of the child's hair.

Fashion cut hairstyles (shaved letters, patterns, etc.) and dyed colours are not allowed.
Headscarves worn for religious purposes must be plain black, white or red.

Tops

A red sweatshirt, or
A red cardigan, or
A red fleece, and
A white or red polo shirt.

PLEASE NOTE: A red hoody is only to be worn for PE, not as standard uniform.

Bottoms

Trousers, leggings or shorts - must be dark grey or black.
Knee length skirt - must be dark grey or black.
Red and white checked dress.

Feet

Flat, plain black shoes (no heels, or above the ankle boots) **or** smart plain black trainers (no colour logos, colour stripes, air bubbles - see below).

Summer uniform (after Easter to October half term)

The following items may be worn:

- Red and white checked dress

Outdoor wear

All pupils should have a suitable coat for outside wear. Pupils in Nursery and Reception need a pair of wellies to be kept in school.

School bags

All pupils should have a sensibly sized school bag to bring in their packed lunch, reading books and any outdoor wear needed in school. Handbags are not acceptable as a school bag. Children in Reception are encouraged to bring a school book bag into school.

Jewellery

It is preferable that children do not wear jewellery to school. The only exception is very small stud earrings (not hoops).

Make-up

Children are not allowed to wear make-up or nail varnish in school.

Non uniform items

Items that are **not** school uniform include:

- Flip-flops/open toe sandals
- Heels or wedges
- High boots
- Shoes with lights or logos
- Tops with patterns or logos other than the school standard
- Hoodies on non-PE days
- Cropped tops

Physical Education

- Nursery children do not change for PE - they remove their shoes and socks.
- Reception children begin wearing their PE to school in January.
- Children in Year 1 to Year 6 come to school in their PE uniform on their PE days.

Hair/Headwear
Long hair should be tied back.
Tops
A red Headley Park hoody and a plain white or red t-shirt.
Bottoms
Plain black jogging bottoms, leggings or shorts.
Feet
A plain black or white pair of trainers.

Swimming

There is no HPPS swimming uniform but children should wear sports swimwear rather than beach wear.
