

RECYCLING SIMPLIFIED SUMMARY

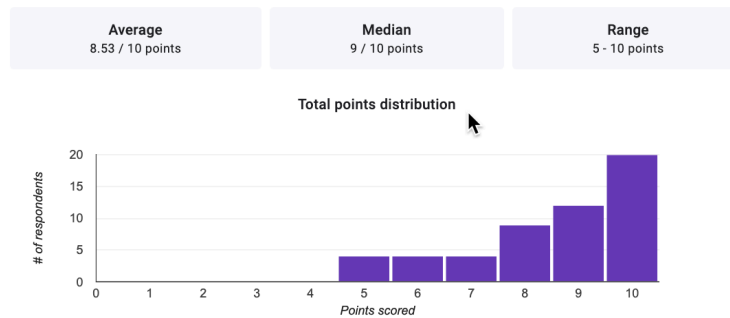
This document is the summary results from the Sustainable Windsor Recycling Simplified project. The project ran from the Saturday prior to Earth Day (April 20) to midnight May 31.

Statistics on the Recycling Simplified Project:

We had a good turnout overall – though it would have been nice to see even more people review the materials and take the quiz.

Key statistics:

- (1) We had over 500 hits to the Recycling Simplified materials
- (2) We had 53 people take the quiz
- (3) We had 45 qualified entries for the drawing
- (4) We had 20 people get 10 out of 10 on the quiz

Quiz Answers

For those of you who want to review the correct answers ... the numbers correspond to the number of incorrect answers. (The tough ones were shredded paper which is NOT recyclable and you do NOT need to remove caps before putting plastic bottles into recycling)

Multiple Choice questions:

- Cardboard **IS** recyclable - 2
- To Go Cups **ARE NOT** recyclable - 9 (plastic lining)
- Milk Cartons **ARE** recyclable - 5
- Shredded paper **IS NOT** recyclable - 18 (Need to be more than scraps)
- Magazines **ARE** recyclable - 5

True/False questions:

You must remove caps on plastic bottles before putting into recycle bin - **FALSE** - 19

When recycling pizza boxes, you should put the greasy portions of the box into the trash - **TRUE** - 6

You must bag your recycled items before putting them into your recycle bin - **FALSE** - 0

You need to ensure recyclables are clean - **TRUE** - 4

You can leave labels and lids on cans/containers for recycling - **TRUE** - 6
