0169.1 - PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AT BOARD MEETINGS

The Board of Education recognizes the value to school governance of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on school matters of community interest. The Board offers public participation to members of the public in accordance with the procedures below. The Board applies these procedures to all speakers and does not discriminate based on the identity of the speaker, content of the speech, or viewpoint of the speaker.

The Board is also committed to conducting its meetings in a productive and efficient manner that assures that the regular agenda of the Board is completed in a reasonable period of time, honors the voluntary nature of the Board's time and using that time efficiently, and allows for a fair and adequate opportunity for input to be considered.

In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such comment, the Board shall provide a period for public participation at every regular meeting of the Board and publish rules to govern such participation in Board meetings.

The presiding officer of each Board meeting at which public participation is permitted shall administer the rules of the Board for its conduct.

The presiding officer shall be guided by the following rules:

- A. Public participation shall be permitted as indicated on the order of business at the discretion of the presiding officer
- B. Anyone having a legitimate interest in the actions of the Board may participate during the designated public participation portion(s) of a meeting.
- C. Attendees must register their intention to participate in the public participation portion of the meeting upon their arrival at the meeting.
- D. Individuals may not register others to speak during public participation.
- E. Participants must first be recognized by the presiding officer and will be requested to preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address, and group affiliation, if and when appropriate.
- F. Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to three (3) minutes duration unless extended by the presiding officer.
- G. During the portion of the meeting designated for public participation, no participant may speak more than once on the same topic unless all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard.
- H. All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer; no person may address or question Board members individually.
- I. The presiding officer may:
 - interrupt, warn, or terminate a participant's session when they make comments that are repetitive, obscene, and/or comments that constitute a true threat (i.e., statements meant to frighten or intimidate one (1) or more specified persons into believing that they will be seriously harmed by the speaker or someone acting at the speaker's behest)
 - 2. request any individual to stop speaking and/or leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum or is disruptive to the conduct and/or orderly progress of the meeting;
 - 3. request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person's conduct interferes with the conduct and/or orderly progress of the meeting;
 - 4. call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum so interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting as to warrant such action;
 - 5. waive these rules with the approval of the Board when necessary for the protection of privacy or the administration of the Board's business.

The portion of the meeting during which the participation of the public is invited shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes, unless extended by a vote of the Board.

The Board may permit individuals to attend meetings remotely through live broadcast; however, public participation will be limited to those who are in attendance at the meeting site only. The Board is not responsible for any technology failures that prevent or disrupt any individual from attending remotely.

- B. We celebrate the four Indian Hill Middle School eighth graders who showcased their innovation and problem-solving skills at the Ohio STEM Learning Network (OSLN) STEM Challenge State Competition on March 4, 2025, at Battelle in Columbus, Ohio. The team consisted of students Ivy Wilkes, Annie Kindberg, Alex Grebe, and Zoey Lampe, who earned their spot at the state competition after being named winners of the Southwest Regional STEM Hub in January.
- C. We celebrate the Indian Hill High School (IHHS) student-artists who earned accolades in the prestigious Governor's Art Competition. Seven students from IHHS had 13 pieces of their artwork selected to advance to the state judging round, an impressive feat in a competition that saw 674 entries from Southwest Ohio; the selections placed Braves in the top 18 percent of works selected. Additionally, four IHHS students received state-level recognition for their artwork, including: Vivian Jenkins' Little Artist; Alistair Woo's Vivian on the Balcony, Alive; Jinming Gu's Chinese Teapots; and Jenisha Rana's Parivar (Family) received an honorable mention, earning distinction as one of the top 300 pieces in the state. The three works by Jenkins, Woo, and Gu will be featured in the Governor's Art Competition State Show in the Rhodes State Office tower from April 21 through May 15.
- D. We congratulate the Indian Hill High School (IHHS) student-athletes who took center stage at the Indian Hill High School Gym for a celebration Wednesday, April 2 to

- commit to continue both academic and athletic careers beyond high school during a college signing ceremony. Participating students included seniors Marley Cady (Soccer, Saint Mary's College), Aiden Faber (Soccer, The College of Wooster), Elizabeth Fullen (Artistic Swimming, The Ohio State University), Aidan Rippe (Football, Ohio Dominican University), and Grant Supinski (Track and Field Thrower-Discus, Shotput, Weight, Missouri Valley College).

Additionally, Indian Hill DECA mentor and teacher Phil Said earned recognition for 25 years of service to the organization.
