#### 4. Gardening Group:

Some geraniums have been lifted for overwintering.

## 5. Corisande Road entrance project:

- a) Recent clearing of undergrowth revealed a change in ground level. Addressing this may mean additional cost and may need to be put out to tender.
- b) Shrubs now need to be taken out

Action: Proposed date 9th Dec 1:00 Bob to put on Facebook to ask for volunteers to help. Local residents to be spoken to, to inform about work being done. AS, HM, BC 5th dec 11:00

- c) New fence height agreed to be 6ft to match fence that will remain. Concern about potential graffiti.
- d) Birmingham Trees for life offered 10 new trees but not ready for them yet.

Action: Helen will be meeting Tree Officer to ask about staking and cages for new trees to protect against vandalism and other damage and where to put trees offered by Birmingham Trees for Life and who is digging the holes for them

- e) In order to keep to Gold, silver, bronze colour scheme proposed tress are:
   2 hawthorn (existing) 1 sycamore (existing), 4 laburnum (new), 2 silver birch (new), 2 cherry (new), 2 hawthorn (new)
- Question over how much maintenance of the site do we intend to do ourselves. We have not maintained this site previously
- g) New sign with or without finials.
- h) Corner house has a large tree that is part of the fence line and hangs over the park potentially unsafely. Unsure whether it is the responsibility of the park or house owner. Survey of all of the parks trees is due next year.

### 6. Gibbins Road woodland extension project:

Bob and Paul have been planting whips of a variety of trees. some fruiting trees. Damage has been noted ie, whips pulled out of the ground and just left. Animal (eg badger) damage or vandalism.
