This law allows any parent to safely surrender their unharmed newborn up to 72 hours old to any EMT, hospital employee or at any fire or police station - NO QUESTIONS ASKED. This law allows a parent to anonymously surrender their newborn without fear of prosecution. Women can safely deliver newborn in a hospital and still use this law. Hospital deliveries are preferred because they ensure safe childbirth and immediate medical care for both mother and newborn. Any infant born in a hospital may be relinquished at that facility if the decision is made within the 72-hour timeframe.
