Academics

There is quite a list of specific standards that 6th-grade students will be learning, but the prevalent conceptual themes in the academic subjects are summarized below:

Math

Mathematical Practices: how to reason and use structure and patterns to solve a variety of problems (MP.1,2,7, and 8)

Multiplication and Division of Fractions and

Decimals: not just the steps, but understanding the concepts and the relationships between numbers (6.NS.A and B)

Ratios and Rates: equivalence and comparison, such as finding the best deal by comparing unit prices (6.RPA.3)

Expressions and Equations: discovering the structure of algebra and solving one-step equations and inequalities (6.EE.A.2 and 6.EE.B.7)

Rational Numbers: extend prior understanding of numbers to include negative numbers (6.NS.C.6)

Geometry and Statistics: expand upon prior knowledge of geometry and introduce the importance of statistics for evaluating information and making decisions (6.G.A and 6.SP.B.4)

Social Studies

Ancient Civilizations: We will study the cultures of ancient history. These will include primitive hunter/gatherer groups, Mesopotamia, Egypt, followed by China, Greece, and Rome.

Language Arts

Foundational Skills: Use knowledge of language and its conventions when writing, speaking, reading, or listening.

Understanding: Determine central themes in the text, citing evidence and making inferences to support our analysis.

Communicate: Develop our written communication skills in the following styles:

- **argumentative** - presenting and supporting an argument to convince the reader of a stated position
- **explanatory** - writing to convey factual information and support it with evidence from texts
- **narrative** - develop real or imagined experiences or events using effective techniques, relevant descriptive details, and well-structured event sequence

Research: Conduct short research projects to answer a question and draw on several sources.

Science

We utilize science kits that provide opportunities for students to get “hands-on” experience with the concepts they’re learning. Besides learning to think like scientists, use the scientific method, and follow the Engineering Design Process, 6th grade includes diving into some very engaging topics:

Life Science: Biological Structure and Function

Physical Science: Electricity, Waves, and Information Transfer

Earth Science: Weather and Climate

Standards-Based Grading
