ASSESSMENT	WHO TAKES IT	PURPOSE	DESCRIPTION
ACCESS for ELLs	English Learners in Grades K-8	State Accountability, Progress Monitoring	The ACCESS is a state required assessment of language proficiency given to students identified as being English Learners (ELs). Students identified as English Learners must take an English language proficiency exam once per year until English proficiency is reached. Results are used to determine supports and services, monitor student progress, and for state accountability reports. The ACCESS is given in multiple sessions and in total can take 1.5 to 4 hours to complete. For more information, <u>click here</u> .
aimswebPlus	Grades K-8	Benchmark, Eligibility for Services, Progress Monitoring	aimswebPlus includes a series of measures that assess reading and math skills. Parts of the assessment are given one on one, but the majority of the assessment is taken online. The amount of time that it takes to complete aimswebPlus varies by grade level, but on average it takes about 60 minutes. For more information, <u>click here</u> to view a short video.
<b>Constitution Test</b>	7th grade	State Accountability	Illinois requires that students are assessed on their knowledge and understanding of the Illinois and U.S. Constitutions. Exact timing of the assessment depends on student readiness.
Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT)	Grades 2 & 5	Class Placement	The CogAT is a group administered measure of ability. The results of this assessment are used to help with identifying students for ELA and math enrichment in Grades 3-5 and advanced placement classes in Grades 6-8. There are three subtests and in total it takes about 90 minutes to complete.

Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM)	Students with significant disabilities Grades 3-8	State Accountability	The DLM is the alternative assessment required by the state for students whose cognitive abilities prevent their participation in the state assessment. The assessment measures reading / language arts, mathematics, and science. Results are used for state accountability reports. The assessment is completed one on one over time and in total takes about six hours to complete. For more information, click here.
Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR)	Grades 3-8	State Accountability	From 2015-2018, students in Illinois have taken the PARCC test for the purposes of assessing student college and career readiness. Illinois changed this assessment to the IAR in the 2018-2019 school year. The IAR is a standards-based assessment that measures both simple and complex expectations. For more information, click here.
Illinois Fitness Assessment	Grades 3-8	State Accountability	Beginning during the 2016-2017 school year, students in grades 3-8 in the state of Illinois are required to complete fitness testing. Components include aerobic capacity, flexibility and muscular endurance. For more information, <u>click here</u> .
Illinois Science Assessment (ISA)	Grades 5 & 8	State Accountability	The Illinois Science Assessment is a computer based test that measures mastery of science standards. Students in Illinois are required to take this assessment in the 5th and 8th grades. Results are used for state accountability reports. The entire assessment is in three segments. While it is untimed, it is estimated to take 120 minutes in total. For more information, click here.
KIDS ASSESSMENT	Kindergarten Students	State Accountability	The 2017-2018 was the first year that the Kindergarten Individual Development Survey was required by the State of Illinois. Teachers are asked to rate students in several readiness domains including Approaches to Learning and Self-Regulation, Social and Emotional Development, Language and Literacy Development, and Cognition: Math. For more information, click here.
MAP	Grades K-8	Benchmarking, Local Accountability, Eligibility for Services, Program Evaluation	MAP is a computer based test that measures academic skills (Math, Reading, Language Usage). The results are used to determine the need for enrichment or intervention. The amount of time it takes to complete the MAP Growth can vary by grade but students take 2-3 subtests that each typically take between 30 to 90 minutes. For more information, click here.
National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)	Grade 8	National Assessment of Student Proficiency	Each year a sample of schools are selected from all over the country to participate in the NAEP. The purpose of this assessment is to gain a better understanding of how students in different parts of the country are performing in the various academic areas. Results are reported for groups of students with similar characteristics (e.g., gender, location, etc.) and

Screening for Behavior and Social Emotional Needs	Screening to identify students with social / emotional needs	In grades K-5 teachers complete the Systematic Screening for Behavior Disorders (SSBD) rating scale and in grades 6-8 students complete the Behavioral and Emotional Screening System (BESS) rating scale. Both tools are part of a reliable and comprehensive system for identifying students who may benefit from behavioral and emotional supports.  Note: Not being administered this year
