Abstract on Salasika Journal should be written in justified, italics, times new roman font 12, single spaced also include keywords. Please separate the abstract keywords with semicolon (;) not using any words or other symbols. In using keywords for articles in Salasika Journal, please avoid using the concept or terms of research for decreasing redundant words and plagiarism issues. Please type keywords in Justified, Bold, times new roman font 12, single spaced. The keywords content should be written in justified, italics, times new roman font 12 and single spaced.

I. INTRODUCTION

The article should be written in English, not in Bahasa Indonesia. Article length from 6000-8000 words for each, counted from abstract until the references, or approximately 12-15 pages article. Texts, notes and reference are all included on the word counted for article requirement for Salasika Journal further publication, but not included all tables, figures and appendices are supported for article publication. All the contents in the article should be written justified, times new roman font 12 with 1.5 spaced. Introduction should not exceed 20% of the whole article structure. For

supporting better citation used in their article, author(s) recommends applying a reference manager, such as Mendeley, Zotero or any other.

Introduction on article should be containing the specific current social phenomenon and problems which are related to aim and scope of Salasika Journal. Introduction, should be containing a representative and an updated data, completed with the research aim and research strategy. A good introduction should be summarizing hypotheses or contradictory views of phenomenon, and explaining visible gaps between the data, theory, and facts which encourages researcher(s) investigating the issue.

II. METHODS

Research methods and material should be clearly and concisely written. Methods on articles should be providing a research step (based on chosen methodology), such as materials, data, computer tools, research protocol, and instruments. Methods should be pointing out how the research was conducted, clearly from the beginning until it is finished in detail. Methods should not exceed 15% of the whole article structure. A citation in the research method should be taking notice of APA style, and it recommends using a reference manager.

III. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Result and discussion should cover 60% of the manuscript.

1. Results

Author(s) must explain the essential findings prior to discussion. The analysis on research findings must be clear, easy to read and understand commonly, informative, comprehensive, and not too specific using theoretical or conceptual language (please describe if any scientific reasons, and adjusted into the common knowledge). Author(s) must be explaining their research

V. REFERENCES

Salasika Journal uses APA 7th referencing style. The references should be in alphabetical order. Use Times New Roman font 12, single spaced. The minimum requirement of the amount of references is 20 references and 30% taken from reputable international journals. It is preferable to have minimum 80% academic journals as the references published in the last 5 years except for main references of particular theories. It is suggested to apply reference software managers like Mendeley, Zotero, or any other.
