Hello 4th Grade Families!

Happy Friday! Although it was a short week, we accomplished so much. We loved meeting and hearing more about Margaret Haddix and her books. After today, we have only 10 days left of school! Here is a quick snapshot of what we covered this week:

Eureka 4: (Grade 4, Module 7)

- **Lesson 10:** Solve multi-step measurement word problems.
- **Lesson 11:** Solve multi-step measurement word problems.
- **Lesson 12**: Use measurement tools to convert mixed number measurements to smaller units.

Eureka 4/5: (Grade 5, Module 2)

- **Lesson 23:** Divide three- and four-digit dividends by two-digit divisors resulting in two- and three-digit quotients, reasoning about the decomposition of successive remainders in each place value.
- **Lesson 24**: Divide decimal dividends by multiples of 10, reasoning about the placement of the decimal point and making connections to a written method.
- **Lesson 25:** Use basic facts to approximate decimal quotients with two-digit divisors, reasoning about the placement of the decimal point.
- **Lesson 26/27:** Divide decimal dividends by two-digit divisors, estimating quotients, reasoning about the placement of the decimal point, and making connections to a written method.

ELC:

- Word Study focused on "ology"
- In Reading, students dove deep into the various informational text structures.
- Literature circles are starting to wrap up. Please make sure your child returns their literature circle book!
- In Writing, students worked on researching for and writing their historical fiction story.

Benchmark:

- We began Unit 8: Natural Disasters
 - The essential question is: How do Earth's natural processes impact our lives?

- We started researching our own natural disasters and filling out a graphic organizer. We answered questions like:
 - o What causes ____?
 - o How does a _____ impact our society?
 - o How do you stay safe during a _____?
- We will create flip books!

Science:

We explored more erosion

All 4th graders will have nightly math and reading homework. We encourage you to set up a homework spot in your home that is stocked with pencils so that your 4th grader is ready to review the day's math concepts. Your child should be reading 20 minutes every night. Math homework goes along with the eureka lessons listed above. Any homework assigned in Science, Social Studies, or Health will be assigned at the teachers discretion.
