

Spread the Word and Raise Funds for

Transgender Youth and Their Families

In response to the rise in extreme legislation banning best-practice medical care for transgender youth, the Campaign for Southern Equality is launching the <u>Trans Youth Emergency Project (TYEP)</u> to provide rapid response support directly to the families of youth who are impacted by anti-transgender healthcare bans across the country. Gender-affirming care bans have spread to 25 states, and trans youth need our support to get the care they need to thrive, regardless of where they live.

Through TYEP, and in close partnership with state and local organizations, CSE is providing emergency grants of \$500, patient navigation support, and accurate information to impacted families to ensure that youth can access the care they need. Since launching this program as a regional effort in 2023, we have directly supported over 1,000 families and individuals and we have provided more than \$500,000 in direct emergency grants. Now, we're taking this program nationwide to make sure any trans youth facing these bans can access the care they deserve.

TYEP provides 1-on-1 custom patient navigation services and supports families of transgender youth with emergency grants to help them travel out of state for care.
