

The Watch UR BAC program is funded by a grant from Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). All costs associated with our programs are covered by the grant, including WhenSeanSpeaks. Our focus is the alcohol and other drugs. We believe in education the community as a whole and offer programs for all age groups. We like to schedule as many programs as possible when traveling to your county and this includes youth, adults, and law enforcement. We are flexible in our program styles and schedules and like to make a program fit your community's needs.

Programs available include:

Student Programs –

Elementary School- Programs will be about 30 minutes total in length to include a short discussion and then some hands-on activities using parachute, bean bag toss with alcohol goggles and small motor skills. We can divide the grades, so groups are smaller and more manageable. We cover the subjects of drugs, alcohol and vaping. It can be just one subject or a little bit of everything.

Junior High or Middle School- Programs can last about 45 minutes in length to include short discussion and hands on activities. Subject matter and activities are adjusted for the proper age group. We cover the subjects of drugs, alcohol and vaping. It can be just one subject or a little bit of everything.

High School- 20 - 30 minute all school presentation to provide educational information for students and faculty.

Subjects can include underage drinking prevention, impaired driving, vaping, marijuana and other drugs. The program could focus on one of those topics or include all of them.

Many students learn best with hands on activities. We have many to choose from and they work best to divide into smaller groups and go through a rotation. The size of the groups depends on each school's enrollment and the amount of time allowed. Hands on activities can include DWI Prevention Simulator (only used in high school and above), Virtual Reality Goggles, Bean Bag toss with goggles, Marijuana Goggles, Drunk and Drugged Suit, Standard Field Sobriety Testing with goggles or other small motor skill activities. There are usually two Watch UR BAC team members that attend an event so if faculty and staff are willing to assist with activities, we can have more opportunities for students. Inviting local law enforcement to help educate with Standard Field Sobriety Testing rotation is a good opportunity for them to have positive interactions with the students. Depending on the size of the group, the activities can last 30-60 minutes per group.

Adult Programs- (This could be a faculty and staff in-service training or a parent program or an event for adult community members or a combination of all the above.) This is a program designed to educate adults about the recent trends in alcohol and drugs. Or it can be a single subject such as vaping. Another option is an interactive program with a mock bedroom. It gives adults the opportunity to look in a possible teen's bedroom to see if they recognize any drug references. They will all then be discussed. This program is a one hour with the opportunity for extended time for questions and discussion.

RECENT TRENDS IN DRUGS AND ALCOHOL

Law Enforcement Training with TCOLE credits - This training is a 2 hour course focusing on the current alcohol & drug impaired driving trends in connection with law enforcement. Programs are TCOLE credit eligible. training. We are flexible to schedule programs during the day or evenings, which ever is best for your county. A community scan will be conducted, and examples of items found locally will be shared. Please be sure to invite local police, Sheriff's Office, DPS, Constables, Game Wardens and even surrounding counties.
