1:55 Mingling & Learning

- Committee members were in breakouts sharing 1-2 things—anything in any context—that
 they've learned this year, as well as what helped them learn. This activity, in part, was to
 serve as a reminder of how curriculum work is rooted in learning and that student learning
 should be at the forefront of our committee work.
- 2:10 Annual curriculum training: compliance, processes, guidance, moving forward . . .
 - See the training link above or the <u>Curriculum Resources page</u> for a PDF of the training slideshow. All members were in attendance for this mandatory training that happens annually. Topics included Ed Code, 10+1, tech review steps, CurrlQunet processes, IDEAA in outlines, and challenges in the year ahead, such as fully implementing the new Title 5 and Cal-GETC structures, handling the impacts of phase one of common course numbering, and adjusting to DEA being on the same timeline as their base course.
 - As a way to return to the tech review world and practice some of what was in the training slides, the CC looked at the early stages of an outline draft for a new course. There was clear appreciation for the subject matter, but there were obvious issues with units-hours, outcomes, justification, catalog description, contents, and methodological development. The CC looks forward to the future development of this course and interdepartmental conversations related to the subject matter.

3:15 A few takeaways from the 2024 Curriculum Institute

- Lisa, Craig, and Rachel shared a few brief takeaways from this summer's Curriculum Institute
 in Pasadena. Topics included enrollment management, IDEAA, noncredit work experience,
 common course numbering, and Cal-GETC. Craig also shared that on day one, in a session
 comprised of several hundred experienced curriculum faculty and staff, gave thanks to the
 CCSF Curriculum Committee for upholding faculty purview over curriculum.
- Homework for 9/4 will be to browse the <u>presentation materials from the 2024 Institute</u> and look at a slideshow or two and share a few takeaways. This will be part two of our training.

3:30 GE update . . . update

- GE courses updated under the hood and GE courses that will be updated by 9/20/24
 - As explained in the link above, around 300 GE courses were updated under the hood in the summer because they were CCSF-only GE and approved AY 2019-20 or later. They will remain on the same 6-year cycle.
 - Departments must take care of AY 2018-19 or earlier outlines that are expiring, including GE outlines.
 - Departments must also take care of outlines moving into new GE Areas 1B and 2 or that are requesting a new local or Cal-GETC area.
 - Past IGETC approvals move into Cal-GETC automatically.
 - Any outline launched by a department will go through CC review and receive a fresh approval date.
 - Some courses that satisfied the old Area A or the Math grad requirement in the past might not satisfy new GE Areas 1B and 2.

- The next under-the-hood phase will involve CCSF GE and Cal-GETC courses not moving into new areas.
- All of this work must be launched by 9/20/24.
