All music majors must complete a successful audition and apply to the Music Industry Studies program.

Placement Exams for the Major:

 MAT 1010 will fulfill the math requirement for this major. You can register for MAT 1010 regardless of your SAT/ACT score and you do not need the Math Placement Test. Consult with your academic advisor if you want to consider a higher level math course for any reason.

If you have already been **accepted** into the <u>Hayes School of Music</u>, your 1st semester schedule will be built for you.

For all students who **intend** to major in Music but who have not yet successfully <u>auditioned</u>, here are recommended courses:

- 1. RC 1000 or UCO 1200 if there are seats available. If not, it's fine to take both classes in the spring semester.
- 2. Enroll in MUS 2613 (Humanity and its Systems- HUM), or
- 3. Enroll in COM 3300 (H(Humanity and its Systems- HUM), or
- 4. Enroll in MUS 2018 (Intercultural Literacy (ICL/ FA)
- 5. Enroll in MAT 1010 (see Math Placement note above)
- 6. Enroll in a Wellness Literacy course
- Enroll in 1 hr Ensemble: possibly MUS 1100 Marching Band, MUS 1104 Jazz Ensemble, MUS 1107 - Small Ensembles, MUS 1109 - Appalachian Chorale (no audition required), MUS 1111 - ASU Glee Club, MUS 1110 - Treble Choir or MUS 1108 - University Singers, MUS 1117 -Gospel Choir (no audition required)

Students who are not admitted to the Hayes School of Music should review the <u>Preliminary Information</u> for Students Considering Music document as well.

- If the courses above are closed, add yourself to waitlists.
- Then add appropriate classes from page 2 of the 2025-2026 Checksheet until you have registered for 12-15 total hours.
- Use the Gen Ed Requirements in the Bulletin to look up Gen Ed course descriptions.
- Use this <u>Course Prefixes/Subjects list</u> to know which subject to choose in the Class Search in AppalNet.
- Rewatch the <u>Gen Ed video in PREP</u> to better understand the Categories and Designations components of Gen Ed.
 - All English Literary Studies: ENG xxxx (LS) designation courses have a prerequisite of R C 1000, First Year Writing (R C = Rhetoric & Composition.)
- BOONE CAMPUS students: Here is a <u>color-coded 2-page General Education checksheet</u> (updated 3x/day) that shows which Boone Campus Gen Ed classes have open seats.

Alternative Courses for Your First Semester:

Can't get into the classes above? Try these:

- MUS 1000 if you have not passed the <u>music theory placement test</u> (Elements of Music Theory, not required but may help prospective students prepare for program admission)
- Foundations of American Democracy course
- Science of your choosing (Exploring Science is encouraged by the School of Music). Must have math prerequisites. Review how to register linked courses (sciences include a lab).
 - PHY 1812 Acoustics and Harmonics (4) Fall only
 - PHY 1814 Sound and Recording (4) Spring only
- ECO 2030 (SS) required <u>business minor</u>. **Strongly recommended** to have college level math as a prerequisite.
- ACC 1050 Business minor.
