Taxation, Subsidies and Welfare

1. Lower top marginal rate of income tax to 38 percent.
2. Eliminate the tax on all hours worked after the fortieth hour.
3. Lower the minimum income at which income tax sets in, broadening our tax base and ensuring greater sustainability.
4. Introduce tax credits for working class families.
5. Pilot a minimum basic income, replacing all benefits but disability benefit with a single income.
6. Eliminate income tax loopholes, such as flat-rate tax expensing.
7. Introduce land-value tax at 12 percent.
8. Introduce same-year full-expensing for corporation tax, boosting investment and growth.
9. Eliminate the lower rate of stamp duty on residential properties, and introduce a flat rate of 1.5 percent on all earnings in excess of 500,000.
10. Lower the rate of stamp-duty on non-residential properties to 4.5 percent.
11. Close the home-purchase loophole in Inheritance and Gift tax.

12. Let long-term cohabiting couples to receive the same inheritance tax and Gift tax treatment as married couples.
13. Increase carbon taxation to 150euro per tonne.
14. Increase diesel taxation to be on parity with the current taxation on petrol.
15. Introduce a tax on plastic bottles, and a concurrent rebate scheme for those individuals who submit their bottles to a local bottle deposit centre.

SocioEconomic

1. Dezone our metropolitan areas in order to encourage home building.
2. Examine and repeal all unnecessary building regulations in order to bring housing prices down.
3. Emphasise a planning regime which makes use of amenities-rich, transit-orientated spaces, and uses infill opportunities in order to ensure system which can house everyone, but sustainably and efficiently.
4. Direct the investigation of upstream construction-supplies firms for violations of antitrust law.
5. Create a new visa to allow high-skill workers to emigrate to Ireland.
6. Ease the selling of wind and solar electricity onto national grids by private individuals.
7. Follow previous governments in facilitating the rollout of broadband in rural areas.
8. Create a system of visa lotteries for low-skill agricultural workers, with an emphasis on bringing geographical diversity.
9. We will deregulate legal services in order to make it more competitive, efficient and affordable for the average Irish person.
10. We will make allowances for litigation financing in the Irish system.
11. We will transition the pensions system towards a defined-contribution scheme with mandated private accounts. This will ensure that our pension system remains both equitable and sustainable going into the future.
12. We will increase funding to the mental healthcare sector, and roll out primary care mental health teams in high-needs areas, with an emphasis on early intervention and proactive treatment.

Education and Youth

1. We will expand tax relief for childminders.
2. We will expand adult:child ratios in creches and preschools, and with childminders.
3. We will introduce a pilot scheme of vouchers for primary and secondary schooling.

4. We will abolish free fees for Irish universities, and replace with a system of income-contingent loans. Tie funding for universities to the repayment rates on these loans.

Social

1. We commit to opposing all legislation which seeks to impinge on the right to free speech, free association, bodily autonomy, or free practice of religion.
2. We will introduce a framework, and ensure adequate training is made available, in order to ensure that both all frontline medical and social healthcare staff undergo training in order to understand and meet the needs of LGBT+ patients.
3. We will ensure that teachers receive training to required to deal with LGBT+ issues in school, with an emphasis on ending all identity-based bullying.
4. Ban the use of solitary confinement in our prisons, a form of punishment which is both cruel and ineffective.
5. Ratify the Optional Protocol on the Protection of Human Rights for People with disabilities.
6. Work to vindicate women's rights, introducing radical and transformative reform to sexual offences law, introduce consent courses into our schools, and work to tackle promotion discrimination in our workplaces.
7. Retain the status of Travellers as a separate ethnic group, and work to reduce discrimination.

Public Sector Reform

1. Establish a new office to investigate corruption, with an independent, non-party-affiliated, directly-elected head.
2. Introduce efficiency audits of our Public Sector, with the chief auditor reporting directly to the Minister for Public Expenditure.
3. Ban all public sector striking when such strikes can't be justified as being in the interests of those consuming those services.
4. Increase the size of bonuses as a proportion of public servants pay.
5. Establish an innovation fund to reward forward thinking and ingenuity in the public sector.

Foreign Affairs, International Relations and Defence

1. We will have a referendum on NATO.
2. We will gradually increase the rate of spending on Defence to 1 percent.
3. We will use the land under Cathal-Brugha barracks for housing, and redistribute the troops stationed there to other bases.
4. We commit to taking in at least 8000 refugees, with 2500 from Venezuela.

5. We will recognise Palestine.
6. We will cooperate with governments around the world in order to ensure the upkeep of human rights in all countries.
