From now on (September 20th, 2018), documents will be listed and organized in this document to make finding relevant information easier.

While there is an older document containing questions on the validity of the organization and what is written, it may be best to review the information as is and go from there as said document is over 5 years old at this point.

Mandira

A short summary of what Mandira is as a city, how they operate, detailing in brief living conditions, and how they survive. (This document is fairly dated, and makes use of the deprecated term 'Drona' to refer to the Mechanation caste of Mandira. It's mostly accurate still beyond the slave trade being far less common with Mandira post Year 320.)

Arguably one of the most important documents to read for those interested in roleplaying in or from Mandira. Details the five legions of Mandira, though some information (mainly the current Afasaras) is not 100% accurate to current events anymore.

A general summary of Hate's Refuge: the home of the Black Cats, haven for Grimalkin, and the border between Aasha and Mandira.

Character Document

A document that holds all characters played by a player. Includes both Mandira and Aasha characters. (OUTDATED)

Describes the Prabhu and their Maut Dastas. Overseers of the legions, and enforcers of the former, respectively.

The Band of the Stag.txt

Details numerous factors to the founding of Mandira, including several mercenary groups responsible for aiding in its realization. **The Band of the Stag**: a former mercenary group that operated between the year 215 and 291 mainly in Kysei; and **Blackwatch**: a yet operating task force based in Chaturanga headed by descendants of Mandira's founders.

Additionally includes information on the supposed god that led to Mandira's conception, **Krodh Dil**.

Misc. Information

A document that contains tidbits that don't fit anywhere else or don't warrant their own document. As of now it contains:

Information about the Battle of Hate: the one and only major conflict to have occurred within Hate's Refuge against Aashan invaders.

Information on Jigyaasa: an embassy on Egwyn for Aasha and Mandira to perform diplomacy. Originally built to observe the now unstable Andhera following the climactic death of Tzeek Cortna, who ultimately died in Jigyaasa.

Information on the Chhaya: Mechanations branded by the Aashan Lord, Raksaka. Carrying the surname 'Chhaya' to denote themselves as such.

Aasha

Details the realm of Aasha, lying beneath Hate's Refuge and consequently Mandira. Includes information on the settlement of Last Light, and various other facets of Aasha, most pointedly information on the three Lords of Aasha.

Aasha Legions

Perhaps one of the largest documents due to constant updates--details the legions of Aasha and the many monstrosities that compose their ranks. With time, came to include information on the recently formed Fourth Legion of Aasha: the Sculptors, carrying their own chain of command, led by the High Seer rather than a Lord.

Additionally contains info on monsters that originated from Aasha and may have found their way into the world beyond, such as the Hanged Man and Wyvern Horrors.

Maargadarshak Vaala's (The Creator) Sanctuary

A brief history regarding the two highest powers known to Mandira: The Creator and Devourer, with more of a focus on The Creator. Most importantly, details how the Cradle of Life came to be. (This document was written in more of an IC fashion, so it's not necessarily straight facts. Important to note that the Creator and Devourer were NOT actually from pre-Heaven's Contention.)
