Non-citizens are ineligible to apply for NSF GRFP, NRSA, or any federal training grants. However, getting experience writing grants is really helpful during grad school and we can always use extra money for our research

- Exception: The [F99-K00 transition to aging](#) award allows students on a visa to apply for funding for their last two years of grad school (and up to 4 years of post-doc funding)

Scholarships (i.e., pays your stipend but have to apply BEFORE starting grad school)

- Fulbright Foreign Student Award
- Other awards specific to your institution, the institution you are applying to – ask about it!
