A Unique Experience for our Instrumental Students

Last Friday, Ms. Jill Dawe arranged for our instrumental students to travel to the First Light Centre to take in a performance called Experience Harmony in Ulliasuk: The Story of Martha Joshua (an Inuit woman from Labrador) with the NSO.



The session aims to support learning about the unique history, languages, cultural practices, and spiritual beliefs of Indigenous peoples in Canada. Through this presentation, students will explore a piece of the rich and diverse culture, voices, experiences, and stories of the Inuit peoples in Labrador. This presentation, entitled Harmony in Ulliasuk, written by Kyle McDavid in consultation with Inuk soprano, Deantha Edmunds, is built on a performance of an original composition by Kyle McDavid. The composition is written for brass quintet, percussion, and voice based on the true story of Martha Joshua, an Inuit woman from Labrador who, at age 7, survived the Spanish Flu pandemic 100 years ago. The performance portrays Martha's story and musical and cultural heritage; the NSO ensemble acts as a metaphor for the power of cultural understanding and collaboration. Harmony In Ulliasuk is based on a theme of "Home in a New World."

This was an incredible opportunity for our students to expand their learning about the Inuit peoples of Labrador. Thank you to Ms. Dawe for organizing.

Bus Reminder


