(0:00 - 0:25)

Good morning everyone. First off, let me come out and tell you, please forgive me for my rant yesterday, but I just had such pent-up anger that had been building and building and building and then this. Well, that broke that friggin' dam.

Well, I mean, in my youth, you wouldn't be there. Anyhow, I thought, okay, I don't want to kill him now, but well, I rang the alarm bell loud and clear at the shelter last night. The staff were investigating.

And I showed them the video that I made. Well, that witness was standing off camera because I've been saying it all along. Animated, you know, is important to me.

(1:10 - 1:26)

You know, if you want to remain right, you've got that right because that's how I am. Only I'm not doing that now. But, yeah, I was on a really rollercoaster ride yesterday for emotions.

(1:30 - 1:52)

So, I do deeply apologize for my actions. That's not why I created this group. But, I mean, you guys basically got to see me explode after being here since the first day of March.

(1:54 - 2:16)

Can you imagine what it's like for those people other than myself? Like, I had the strength, you know, to keep it together and whatever. Well, most of the time. But, you know, there was a pressure building.

(2:16 - 2:45)

And, you know, this fucking incident just caused it to explode. I love my child so, so much. And you have no idea the pain that I have suffered in my heart because I couldn't shield her against what happened to her.

(2:49 - 3:12)

And, yeah, there's a story for every single one of these homeless people. And like myself, well, there was a lady that tuned in yesterday during the rant. She used to pick me up from the hospital in Winchester and drive me back to Chesterville to my daughter's apartment.

And, she was, I'll bet you, surprised listening to my confession about what I had not revealed because I never, ever lied about my past. When I did say something about my past, it was usually during one of them times where I went, normal. But, you know, I could only do that for a little while and then it was, zoop, back to the streets again.

But some other city, province, never country, I never lived anywhere but Canada. I went on extended vacations to the U.S. twice, that was it. But, Canada, I'm very patriotic.

Extremely patriotic. I was there when, instead of being the Dominion of Canada, we became Canada. And we got our flag.

(4:28 - 4:41)

So, yeah, I've seen the astronauts land on the moon. Well, I've seen newsreels of Woodstock. A little young to be there.

But, yeah, even the assassination of President Kennedy. I remember one time when I was relating, you know, I was there situations or incidents to my daughter. She'd go, holy fuck, Dad, you're old.

I said, how do you keep that up? I said, you know what I'm gonna do? She goes, what? I said, I'm gonna go around and tell all your friends. You got a daddy that's almost a half a century older than you. You wouldn't do that, would you? I love little pieces, man.

Like, we just go together like two pieces of a puzzle. Bounce off each other, you know, like cracking jokes and stuff. I didn't know if I was gonna live long enough to really enjoy my life with my daughter.

But for some unknown force, reason, destiny, I had no idea. There's ships around up there, so you just don't know. But, you know, I never thought that I could be sick on oxygen, sometimes, and still smoking.

But who gives a fuck if you're dying anyways? You know, like, God damn it. And do I really care if it does it quicker? At this point in my life, no. But just something keeps forever driving me forward.

I thought I had lost that when I ended up spending 18 years off. That was a fucking record for me. So, wow.

(6:53 - 7:11)

Here I am again. And I took the death of the final person to keep me off the streets. After that, I got pretty damn hungry for them, so I moved even further away from the streets. That lasted for two and a half years. And I said, fuck this, and I'm back in Kingston where I belong. I had another offer to team up with somebody to go in on rent for an apartment. And it was a one bedroom. And it was \$1,800 a month. But you had to pay all the utilities. And he's like, and I said, listen, listen, listen, listen. First off, if you've got to pay all utilities, you better watch out when it comes to water. And I know you like long showers. Because he used to drive me crazy when I knew him in Belleville. And the fucking guy said, I have to have a shower first. Yeah, three hours later.

I said, how long were you in the shower? He said, I fell asleep. Oh, wow. So, you know, like, it's not the water that you're paying for, really, when you're using it.

It's what you're flushing down the toilet, running down the drain, you know. And it's like two and a half times the water. So you're paying more for the sewage fees than anything else. And that's something that a lot of people forget or don't know about when they're renting places and then they find they can't afford to pay their bills. So, pass the word. You know, watch out for that.

All utilities, be sure you find out about water and sewage. Those can be, you know, like, kind of tricky. Because, I mean, you know, depending on how much water you use, it's just great. But, like, all your dishwater, your toilet flushings, your showers, your baths, the sinks, you know, that's all using water. But the water is not as expensive as what the sewage fees are. Then hydro, there's another one.

If you're on OW or ODSP, I think, I'm pretty sure on OW, I don't know, damn it. You can get a reference or something from your worker to submit to utility companies and the deposits or whatever gets waived. A lot of people don't know that.

And I just, I found all this shit out last night because after I got done renting and raving in here, I went back to the shelter because I just didn't feel like being alone anymore. And I went back and there's a few older guys like my age and I think maybe one or two younger ones, very younger ones, sitting there and I'm hearing all this talk from these guys. You know, and it's like, what the fuck, where have you been? Stone Age? But I'm not up enough on all the resources here yet because as far as I have experienced and observed, there is not a single true blue resource in any of these fucking shelters.

What good is that? Why stick out a hand? Tell them, come with me and just before they get to you, snatch your hand away. Follow through with it. There is an urgent cry from homeless street people and they need to have a voice and that's why I am here.

And I'm not sitting here looking at everything going on and then going home. No, I sit there, I look, listen and learn while being an actual homeless street person myself and I love it. I am again back with the people who show more love and caring than my own family and that was why it was so important to me that from me on, I am insisting on nothing but family love and although I never ever could tell my baby no and that didn't make me a dad spoiling his daughter, quite often I couldn't but I felt very bad when I couldn't because I felt, okay, she's my child, I need to provide and care for her and Bailey never asked for anything outrageous.

She was not into all that girly fashion stuff, all that stuff and whatever. No. Now, oh God, some of her pictures on Facebook or no, yeah, Facebook, yeah, are quite provocative, you know and I'm just like, baby, what are you doing? But I can't put my hand over it, you know.

Shit. Like, I sometimes get quite scared for her but, you know, I told her right from the start when she started to learn that her body was changing and she was going to become a woman, you know, a young woman and I told her, you know, you're on your own because she used to call me and ask me if it was okay and I said, sweetie, I told you before, I would

never ever, okay, talk you out of any of your decisions but I would definitely discuss it if I objected but my objections never ever, ever influenced her decision because she knew damn well that if I objected to something that I didn't want to see her doing or I was thinking suspiciously, you know, about, you know, because she was wanting to do this film production, I don't know, actress or, I don't know, some kind of crap and they wanted her to pay up like 10 grand or some fucking thing and then go all the way to California. Do you know where a lot of those pretty young girls end up in cases like that? Not in very good places and when she told me she wanted to do that, man, I was fucking terrified and, you know, if she had asked me for money and she had proved to me beyond a shadow of a doubt to go there and that it was legit, I would help her, yeah, why not? She's my child.

And, you know, just because your child turns 18, that don't mean you gotta quit looking after them or taking care of them. You know, you become a parent, that's a lifetime job until you die. So, you know, hey buddy, spread your legs, pay the price, you know.

But, you know, like, when she was younger, like, this is kind of funny, because I am almost 50 years older than my daughter. She was born in February of the year I turned 47. Yeah, I'm quite a bit older, but, you know, like when she was like 9 or 10, you know, I'm trying to talk to her or she'd be spilling to me, spilling something to me.

And the last line she types up, she goes, and I don't wanna see any of your old man theology. Because she knew I was gonna break into some sharing of wisdom that I had learned in my years and my experiences across the country. So, yeah, that was when I knew that we were gonna start interacting a hell of a lot better, because she was getting older and I could start relating more stuff to her that she would understand.

So she had gone from being like little daddy's girl to, you know, bigger daddy's girl. And she's been a daddy's girl her whole goddamn life. So, and because I was in a wheelchair and I couldn't, you know, play soccer or, you know, go down the slides at the park with her anymore.

I mean, that was like trying to put a, I don't know, whatever, it would have been, you know, like quite impossible. So, you know, because of both of us being older than me in a chair. So we had to start finding other things to do together.

And one thing that I was totally amazed to find was my daughter's love of what's above us. The sky, space, the universe, the stars. She shares my passion for that.

And I was just like, you know, and she's like, well, dad, didn't I used to sit and watch Star Trek with you? Yeah, that's true. She did too. She's about two or three years old.

And she even had like this built-in little alarm clock to tell her when it was coming on and down to my office in the basement. Is it on yet, daddy? She'd sit on my knee and we'd watch my computer. Well, at that time I had like a TV card in my computer that I could just, you know, watch television on it instead of using it as a computer.

Yeah, I know, I got all kinds of gadgets and gadgetry. But isn't this quite the contrast to yesterday? I mean, but that's kind of the way I've been all my life, you know. It's just deal with it, get it over with, get it done and fucking move on, you know.

And all that and that video will be deleted in 30 days. I'm hoping my secret partner there, Tish, is still transferring these videos over to Rumble. If any of you know how to do it, please do it.

Share it anywhere else. Because I'm giving you raw, bare-naked fucking details.

Uncensored. I ain't gonna pull no plugs. Well, I'm not gonna sit and rant and rave and swear at this, at that, every 30 seconds. But, you know, I just, I can't emphasize the impact of what I'm trying to make the people see and understand what the life of one of these people that they have so generously freestamped us as disgusting, degraded, you know, drug users, drug dealers, criminals.

And I don't even want to go the other way so we'll end up criminal first. But, yeah, last night, idiots. They're told that they could on the 3rd they were told that they could line up their bags at 6 o'clock at night. Because prior to that, people were dropping bags at the very first spot they would line up. And, uh, this, this, two guys actually, two, two. The first one, I put the run to him.

And, like, me, I don't care. Like, people, they got what, 55 beds? They could be at 54. And that's it, they're full.

Why? Because I have that last bed. So, um, my daughter was worried that with the winter coming, she didn't want me being hopeless, homeless, but hopeless. Well, that too, yeah. But, um, she didn't want me to freeze to death. Because I actually saved her little tootie two winters ago. I was still in Cornwall then, and her goddamn sister, her nut-bar sister, and, thank God, her half-sister, because her older sister, although I've always followed my daughter, is not my daughter.

I adopted her at one year old. But, I mean, when I first spotted my daughter's older sister, um, I fell in love with the little creature, you know, she was so cute and little button, you know, and in about, I think, oh God, two, three days, I was sitting at the computer doing something, it was early in the morning, Steph had gone to work, and, um, Jesse was in school, and, and I felt this pair of cold little arms come around my neck, and, uh, I kissed on my cheek, and she goes, Morning, Daddy. Ka-ching! Like somebody hit a friggin' gong.

You know, it was the most wonderful feeling I had ever felt in my life, because to that point in my life, I had never, ever, ever had a child call me Daddy. Wow. Okay, that was, that was just like, to me at the time, it was the most explosive and wonderful feeling to hear those words, Morning, Daddy, you know, and it just, that, my friends, was the end of my trip across the country, back and forth, here and there.

I was 44 years old, and I think I made the smartest decision I ever made in my life, and that was, I wanted to be with my daughter's mother, because I had truly fallen for her, and, uh, away I went. I was whisked away from the streets of Toronto, again. Toronto.

Now I wouldn't go there if you paid me, but, alas, I have Kingston now, so, big difference, but, my daughter's mother put my feet on the path of being something that I never, ever dreamed I would ever be. A father, you know, a steady lover, a provider, protector, you know, a husband, I was becoming all of that, and the adrenaline, and the rush I got from it, I just can't compare it with any other drug. I'm not saying it's more powerful, I mean, there's some whoop-ass shit out there, but, well, it was back in my day, too, so, you know, the rush, people have always, when they hear that, they say, okay, oh, you mean like a drug rush? No, just a rush, okay, a wave of pleasure or something, you know, but a rush, it does not have to be drug-induced, but the rush I got when I fought, how much love I had for that family at that point in my life, well, almost that family, the little boy turns out to be a real hellion, well, boy, did he run into the wrong guy.

That kid, when I first got there, he ruled the house. He told his mother what to do, and he was only eight years old, and I'm like, pardon moi? I said, okay, I sat him down the first time he messed up with me, I don't remember exactly what it was, and I looked at him, and I said, I'm telling you right now, dude, I said, you just met your match, but the trouble with meeting me is I'm going to be beating you. Now, I didn't mean physically, and I never did hit him, as God is my witness, I've never harmed a child, and I've never hit a woman.

I would cut off my limbs before I do something like that, but, you know, I just made it clear to him that I am not letting him get away with anything, and he was so predictable that I caught him at like 99% of what he was up to, which was no good, and that last 1% boy, he didn't get anything by me very, very much. Well, he did once or twice but uh That was only because I wasn't completely in the know now you see what happens That's why i'm always Looking up and reading up thing because if I had done some reading I would have known about that And then the little sucker wouldn't have caught me

But oh well shit happens, right? I I'm not one to sit and wallow in pity or anything and I hate fucking pity

Don't feel sorry for me I feel sorry for you for feeling sorry for me Like what gives you a right to feel sorry for me, you know, I mean like Did you put me there? No.

So why are you sorry? Don't say you're sorry Best case scenario don't say anything at all keep your Thoughts opinions comments or whatever to yourself, right? To each his own. That's what this god-given country gives freedom to speech So huge if more people would stand up for themselves and Face things with More strength and determination we wouldn't have all this drug abuse and everything but me it was How did I actually well, okay how I got started on the weed was I was in the children's aid in Belleville And one of the group homes I got stuck and they were a couple of flower children.

This was in 1973 And um I had gone to visit with a You know Uncle this auntie that whatever, you know, but they're not really your aunt and uncle but just friends of your parents Well, I didn't have any parents either uh I went there and we had Chopped down a big tree that was kind of dying right in front of the cottage on the water on the bay of plenty And the tree went through the ice and Which was quite thin so that When it re-froze it re-froze smooth instead of all bumpy and whatever So, uh Oh Sorry guys Um Where the hell oh, yeah, right So I went back I think it was a couple weeks later, but colds fell and everything and froze the ice all around the tree So that we could walk out on the ice and with chainsaw so, uh I got to use a chainsaw I was 15 years old Wow what a thrill and um Oh, I must have been I guess About

a day and a half later there, uh, it was starting to snow some And I was still cutting the tree up. I mean it was me all by myself. So you know I mean, I wasn't a weakling because I was tracking field and whatnot when I was in school Hey, you know where my parents were I had the engine running And passed but I wasn't lanky.

I mean I worked I worked at a dairy you know, I was You know hooking onto the milk crates of uh Like five and six bags six crates stacked high You know and dragging them across the deck Shit, you know, I was not a weakling Finally I got cutting through a branch And I went to step forward a bit and whoops I went down on the fucking earth But on the way down I was still holding the chainsaw now this is I I always had good reflexes very fast reflexes All of this happened like practically in the blink of an eye I threw the chainsaw away from me Because I didn't want to land on my back and have it bounce and hit me in the head So I threw it And the fucking thing hadn't stopped spinning yet and it hits My right foot right up my big toe And took it off Oh, yeah put a like an angle cut right up towards the toe of my boot and I didn't even notice because I I didn't feel it when it hit And I picked myself up off the ice Picked up the chainsaw and saw a big red puddle forming on the ice I looked inside of my boot. I thought holy fuck I hit my boot So I went up to the house pulled off my boot and there was no toe it was inside the boot So, um That was a real mucked up situation man They called the ambulance now, here's the trouble my So-called aunt and uncle's cottage was right down by the water. So they were only about 20 feet off the the edge of the water But you had to go up a little bit of a landing and then up some more Uh, mr. Ambulance could couldn't get down there Uh with a stretcher and then go Back up because how they got back and forth and whatever uh You know a rototiller whatever They had one of them with no rotor on it just uh, uh, oh yeah, they had the No, they had the back wheels of it the drive wheels hooked to a little wagon That they used to go up and down the hill with rather than try to climb it and I think my first sarcastic question ever to clayton was What fucking genius builds a cottage all the way down there And you gotta get up and there's no stairs I mean, at least you could throw down some mountain climbing equipment or something, you know, like oh Geniuses, huh? Is that word actually True I don't know I kind of lost my train of thought there where I was talking about You know I can't say that that other gentlemen and senior citizens like myself Would react adapt would deal with this lifestyle if it was anyone other than me Um My years of experience Uh, I just I guess probably my strongest power Here among these people, you know, and It like me I wouldn't have given these guys a voice If I didn't think that they needed it I wouldn't do that.

That's just not me Like I said way back in other videos that have been deleted I had You know, no family No love My brother and I it wasn't so much that we Uh Uh Loved each other but rather we clung to each other for safety and protection the protection part never worked, but safety part, you know Each other's arms, you know, I mean Kaboom kabang, you know, like we were joined at the hip for christ's sake and there was two years between us so But I think when When the genealogy or whatever or the dna was all getting put together and shit Something boobooed and I guess it all got dumped into me Because My brother True mama's boy I mean I love them dearly i'm no longer angry or or anything at him for what happened, but I do miss him terribly because I remember all the challenges And the trouble that we got into, you know But I sometimes wonder where Him and I would be at this point in our life, I just he'd be 65. He'd just be becoming a senior Fortunately, he was 23 when he was gone Only family member I ever loved in my whole life out of That family not this family But I have said Many many years ago I was a young fella. I was around 10 years old Uh, my

dad had just caught my brother and I smoking And he went to the store and he bought two Cigars And they were the strongest ones Michael he made us both He handed us both one each of the cigars and told us to light up And start smoking So, you know michael and I well, we kind of knew about cigars then why come on ever so So we were puffing on him he says ah, that's not smoking So dad pulled out a menthol shaker that he smoked ammo And he lit it and he Took a drag and he inhaled and he says that's smoking.

Michael. I just looked at him all bug-eyed And He says you gotta inhale Sorry, i'm just playing back the picture in my head here it's just Like I can look back on a lot of shit my brother and I uh Did or got blamed for Okay, it was one or the other and uh The way my brother and I stood side by side, you know But I I had heard stories from sperm donors Uh one time I remember sitting drinking wine Uh, and he was getting drunk and stuff. He was telling me about how um One time they had a party And like, um I was uh, just a little buck two and a half years old and michael was still a baby When he was born so he was born like a munch And uh Uh, he started crying And i'm like baby baby And That fucking piece of shit sperm donor was standing there in the door letting the baby cry And And something just I i'm two and a half years old and something pinged in me And he said that I looked like I had the look of my eyes of total fear I mean unless you accidentally Or I mean on purposely attack a small child that size.

What the fuck would they have to fear at that age? unless You put it there So, you know, but it uh It didn't matter to him anyways, he left I was there Because mike and I were both in the same room. He had a crib. I had a bed So I started thinking now this is The very first time Uh but uh because apparently sperm donor let his old egg donor Go see and she was hiding on the corner but I I kept begging My brother mike to to stop crying and finally I picked him up and I went over to the dresser I opened the dresser.

I took all the clothes out I put him inside there and closed the drawer And went back to bed. I couldn't hear him crying anymore my very first case of uh improvising anyhow, parents went through in their bedroom the next morning and Mom would come streaking back out screaming and everything. She didn't know That I had put mike in the drawer And I don't know dad came in and he went screaming out that somebody had kidnapped the baby and mom said no, uh words got him in bed with him And that's what she thought because from where she was she couldn't see me put him in his dresser And they called the cops They I come I wake up I come out what's going on and everything oh somebody's telling your brother I went back in and Bed with mikey in the bottom dresser door The only one that I could reach So, you know I got a good goddamn looking for that after everybody flew out and that I think Was the furthest i've ever been able to go back in my memory Um, that's why When I had the opportunities in northern manitoba, I really got to know about the native spirit, you know, and It opened my eyes to a lot of things And then later on I studied I.T Again Becoming aware of a lot even more

So I guess you might say I have an awareness that is totally unique And Very very Very

Like I said here in places like this and whatever One because i'm getting too goddamn old to keep holding my temper. Uh, because it just all started to build again this morning with, you know what? Boy, that fucker keeps running into me over there.

But, I made it clear to the two staff members last night, and I will be talking to the manager about it. But, I made it clear. I have not ever, ever, ever raised my voice, got into a fight.

I have never caused any trouble. I have never broken any of the rules. The only thing I ever did was stand up to them and back them down when they thought I was one of them.

Telling others that they, themselves, have stamped everyone away. And that they are better than me. Well, when they tried that shit with me, it didn't work.

Once we came to that understanding, you know. But, you see, again, like, the things that I was saying in my own defense of standing up to them and backing them down. I did not step over the line.

And my boss just thinks I got no diplomacy. Bullshit! I got all kinds of what I want to use. I just have to find a situation to use it.

And, I mean, that's how I trained myself to do that, by taking business administration. An eight-year course crammed into three. Adult education.

So, a lot of work. Fifteen hours a day. So, but, I did it.

And I graduated top of the class of Valedictorian. And, uh, then... Oh, I'm not going into that story.

Anyhow, that's what taught me how to, you know, deal with everything. Look at things problematic. Look at things practically. And, you know, just ask. Learn. Know. And that became sort of like my unwritten philosophy. Ask. Learn. Know.

So, yeah, information is definitely a must. And I suggest everybody, if you can, you know, like, seek out Chrystal Wilson [https://substack.com/@kayakchk] or something. And I'm sure she is completely up to date on all the various resources.

Now, because of my own inside infiltration investigation into all this shit, I've learned that none of the services provided here are what they are. And they are nothing but hurry up and wait. I'm not going to say how.

Another thing- I managed to get some video of the staff of the Hub one day. It was a rainy day, so everybody was inside. And the elevator, I was supposed to be coming down from upstairs because I had left something in my pod.

And the door opened on the office floor. Whoops! There was a whole bunch of these young... There was a whole bunch of them sitting there, playing on their phones and whatever. And they didn't watch TV.

And bing! They all started working on their computers. But, you know, like, I probably... I was thinking about maybe getting my phone out to record them, but the door closed. I don't know how... I think they just sent that out or whatever.

I don't know. You know. Just like, you know, I'd like to know why Home Based Housing has such a large office staff. You know, and all this shit. And... Now they're spreading out and sticking their fingers into everything, but they're still playing at ending homelessness.

I... There's about two things on my top hit list right now. And that is, fentanyl, no matter what type, style, color, whatever. It's evil. It's like sucking on the devil's dick. If you can, help anybody if you want to climb that.

Don't turn into a fucking rat. Keep it to yourself.

And, um... Pedophiles.

I just couldn't stay quiet last night, you know that? Everywhere I went in that fucking shelter for the last three days, I almost run him over by accident. Because he'd suddenly be in my way. Like, it's... Talk about tempting fate. Holy shit. But anyway, I'm... You know, I'm not as mad about it now as I was yesterday.

I don't know what that... Oh, shit. So... But... I had said way, way back... That... If one day I ever had a child, or children, that I would love them, and they would love me, unconditionally. This was right after I got a beating.

And then, by the time I was 12, I was not rescued by the Children's Care Society. I was simply downgraded a few notches from the evil that I was experiencing with my folks. There's a name that I can call them, instead of parents.

But... I don't know, I've always felt like that I've been on a mission in my life. And... Because I have found so many unique, and rather strange type abilities and skills... When I was younger, they scared the fuck out of me when they happened. They've come in very handy over the years, and of course, become much sharper.

So... Because of all of that... Was so powerful, and so strong in me... Defiant... Right to the end, I'll be defiant. You know... It was so strong, that I managed to get through every goddamn pile of shit that I had to shovel through in my lifetime. You know, from extreme tragic... To extreme pleasure.

You know, and now I sit here, and I'm thinking... Have I missed anything? A lot of thinking... Looking back and shit on that, and... No, I haven't. Nothing. Because... At 44, do you think I've thought about having a child? No. I just happened to be... An older man... Than her mother, and... I guess that was the only reason. But again... Those are the kinds of stories I would love to share, but that's not what this group is about. Anyhow, you saw how I... Exploded and let it all out yesterday.

I'm here at the park today, and I intend to stay here, and wait in that shelter, the entire fucking day until tonight. Because that cat's like a moon. Oh, alrighty, guys.

Gotta shake my head and get off this again. I'm not as strong as I used to be. What am I doing? Okay, anyhow... Yeah,

I...
