ABSTRACT. (12 pt, bold)

The abstract should briefly state the problem or purpose of the research, indicate the theoretical or experimental plan used, summarize the principal findings, and point out major conclusions. Abstract length is one paragraph. Abstract should not exceed 200 words. Reference citations should be avoided (11 pt, space 1).

1. INTRODUCTION (12 pt, bold, space 1.5)

State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results. The manuscript may include sections such as an introduction, methods, results, discussion, and conclusions. It is important that the file be saved in the native format of the word processor used. The text should be in two-column format, except for the title to abstract. Keep the layout of the text as simple as possible. To avoid unnecessary errors, you are strongly advised to use the 'spell-check' and 'grammar-check' functions of your word processor. It is noticed that Tables and Figures are placed at the end of submitted article. If you use abbreviations and acronyms, if any, are defined upon first usage. (11 pt, space 1.15)

Results should be clear and concise. This should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. A combined Results and Discussion section is often appropriate. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature. (11 pt, space 1.15)

4. CONCLUSION (12 pt, bold, space 1.5)

The main conclusions of the study may be presented in a short Conclusions section, which may stand alone or form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section. (11 pt, space 1.15)
