A coyote is bigger than a fox but smaller than a wolf.</li> <li><b>SUPPORT</b>—Tell your child that señor means "mister" in Spanish. The ~ (tilde) over the 'n' changes the sound of the letter, so señor is pronounced (/sehn*yor/).</li> <li><b>SUPPORT</b>—Ask your child to point to the coyote in the image. Then have students point to the rabbit.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Read the story</li> </ul> <p>When your child gets to p.25:</p> <p>Explain that tortillas (/tor*tee*yahs/) are round flatbreads made from cornmeal or wheat flour. They are a traditional Mexican food.</p> <p>Explain that a feast is a big, fancy meal.</p> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Answer the 11 <a href="#">comprehension Questions</a> (Answer key included to check work)</li>
