B. Abstract Content

- Abstracts must be between 200-250 words and align with the conference theme.
- Provide a concise and descriptive title for your research.
- Briefly introduce the research topic and its significance.
- Clearly state the main objectives or research questions.
- Summarize the methodology used in your research.
- Present key findings or results. Avoid vague statements such as "results will be discussed." Highlight the conclusions drawn from your research and their implications.
- Indicate the implication of your study in relation to Sustainable Development Goals.

C. Abstract Formatting Guidelines

- Submit in the .doc file format. (Preferably MS WORD)
- Use Times New Roman.
- Apply margin .5" on the left side, 0.5" on the right side, and 1" on the top and bottom sides.



D. Author Information

- Include names of all authors, their affiliations, and contact information.
- Clearly indicate the presenting author.

E. Abstract Submission Process

- Ensure that you meet all submission deadlines.
- After submission, kindly wait for a notice of acceptance via email.

F. Abstract Scoring Rubric

Contains all the necessary elements/soundness of contents (rationale, objective, methods, results)	40 points
Quality of abstract/accurately presented the results	30 points
Overall impact and relevance of work relative to SDGs	20 points
Understandable, well written, and free from grammatical errors	10 points
TOTAL	100 points

G. Abstract Review Process

- Abstracts will undergo a peer review by the committee within two weeks after the submission deadline.
- Acceptance or rejection of the abstract will be sent via email within two weeks of submission. If revision is required, the revised abstract must be sent back within a week. If an abstract is accepted, a notice of acceptance will be sent via email.

H. Abstract Submission Deadline

- Abstract submission will be until **July 5, 2026**

Abstract must be font size 11, single-spaced, indented, and justified. The name and surname of the author(s) and the affiliation they work for are included after the title. The research manuscript shall not exceed 10,000 words, excluding the Acknowledgments and Reference section. Author/s must follow the style guidelines of the American Psychological Association, 7th Edition.

SAMPLE ABSTRACT

Purposive Communication (PC) and Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC) Rating of Philippine University Students

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ABSTRACT

This study investigated the relationship between PC grade and TOEIC rating, measured the influence of PC on international communication skills and identified insights and experiences regarding the value of PC in developing communication skills. The study was anchored on the communicative competence theory. Convergent mixed-methods design was used in this study by combining quantitative (TOEIC rating and survey data) and qualitative data (interview) taken from 427 randomly selected 1st year students. Results show that there is some catching up to do in communication skills as both reflected in the respondents' PC performance and TOEIC ratings. However, a very strong influence of PCs on improving their communication skills was found. Supporting our quantitative data, results showed that lessons and experiences in PC are extremely important for multicultural understanding, better sociolinguistic awareness, and increased competencies in school and workplace discourse. Support for additional language courses for the college curriculum was also articulated. Producing communicatively competent graduates not only for local discourse but more importantly for international communication provides a competitive advantage so they can well navigate the terrains of the increasingly evolving landscape of the workplace. This mixed-methods study on PC and TOEIC is first of its kind as we argue that while language proficiency levels provided using TOEIC rating may not totally capture the overall linguistic repertoire and competence of college students, it is very helpful to provide baseline information for better curricular offerings, improved instructional design, and enhanced language learning experience.
