A RESOLUTION to ADVOCATE for a Hybrid Option for Academic Instruction

WHEREAS, the University has decided to switch to in person classes at the end of the month of January;

WHEREAS, the physical health of all Georgetown students and staff are crucial to these individuals' academic and personal successes;

WHEREAS, some students are immunocompromised and face increased risk to COVID-19 exposure, and others live with or are in frequent contact with immunocompromised friends and/or family members;

WHEREAS, the University has not guaranteed general accommodations for immunocompromised and other vulnerable students once classes move in-person;

THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED by the Georgetown University Student Association Senate as follows:

1. URGES that the University allow for a hybrid option for immunocompromised and other vulnerable students after January 31, 2022;
2. DEMANDS that in the event of any COVID quarantine, students receive an online option to attend classes;
3. ENCOURAGES the university to collect and publish statistics on the percent of immunocompromised students;
4. ENCOURAGES the university to provide students with a form to fill out if they believe that as an immunocompromised student that they should be provided with protection through an online option.
