PARTY BUS



Ride around town in a “Chiva Parrandera” a colorful, traditional-style party bus used as a mobile venue for celebrations, nightlife tours, and group events. Rooted in Andean and Colombian folk transport traditions, these vehicles feature open-air or vibrant custom seating, loud sound systems, and dynamic lighting.

Key Features

- **Entertainment:** Equipped with live or professional DJs, music animation, and neon or LED party lighting.
- **Drinks & Service:** Usually come with an open bar, a bartender, ice, and cups.
- **Atmosphere:** Designed for dancing and socializing while moving through the city.



Hop in, there is live music, pole dancing by beautiful chicks, drinks and lots of PHUN!

Whoever takes this ride will never forget it, many have repeated the tour year after year.

CITY TOUR

Be ready to board a bus early in the morning for a City Tour, there will be three stops: Miraflores Locks, Abou Saad Shrine Center and Grand Lodge of Panama Temple.

Miraflores Locks:

The Panama Canal considered one of the 7 marvels of the modern world, opened for transit in 1914.



Walk up to the Visitor's Area deck beside the locks where you will see live the locks operation. Watch ships of any denomination going up and down both ways, from the Pacific Ocean South entrance towards Miraflores Lake, transiting both ways. After watching ships going through you, you will be guided to the I Max 3D Theatre, you will be provided with a set of 3D glasses. The movie takes about 30 minutes telling the story that starts back to the 16th Century narrated by Morgan Freeman.

Abou Saad Shrine Center:

The second stop will be at the Shrine Building, formerly the Albrook Air Force Base Officer's Club, located in the middle of the Albrook neighborhood built in the early 1930's. The building houses Abou Saad offices and ball rooms, the Lodge Room of the District Grand Lodge of Massachusetts at the Panama Canal where you can see firsthand the gallery of Past Grand Masters and District Grand Masters, worth to notice that the Treasurer's Office chairs is over a hundred years old. At the end of the visit you will be taken to the FEZ CLUB, the Shriners Bar for refreshing drinks and beer.



Grand Lodge of Panama Masonic Temple:

This is the last stop, the hundred-year-old building located at 13th Street West is in the outer limit of Casco Viejo. You will visit the three lodge rooms and the Banquet Hall Past Grand Masters Gallery and exhibition of all kinds of memorabilia.



The bus will take you back to the hotel for a hefty lunch, drinks and a comforting nap to recharge batteries for what follows next, Mirth and PHUN!

TOBACCO & RUM

If you are a Rum lover don't miss this opportunity!



For centuries Panama has been a rum producing country, in the past two decades the rum industry has evolved from locally sold rums to specialized high priced world quality bottles.

Exports to several countries continue to rise, some keep the original brand name, other are sold in barrels to customers who brand their own names with the condition that a label clearly states its origin, Panama.



It will be a tasteful afternoon to discover the characteristics of three brands with different aging processes, the most common are Solera and Single Barrel, these two categories will be explained in full.

Smell, sip slowly, enjoy flavor, smoothness, and other characteristics while smoking an imported cigar, a must when tasting fine rums for added enjoyment.

At the end, we will raffle each bottle for a token.

CASCO VIEJO NITE TOUR



Late on the evening a bus will be provided to transport you to “Casco Viejo” for a walk and pay as you go drinks in street bars and cafes.

When Henry Morgan the pirate visited “Panama la Vieja”, the first settlement in the Pacific Ocean of the American Continent back in 1671 the city was burned down by its settlers to avoid looting. Two years after in 1673 the second city was erected, currently known as “Casco Viejo” a mixture of Spanish and French architecture. One of UNESCO’s World Heritage Sites. Walk along its paved with clay bricks streets has the feel of being in the New Orleans French Quarters.



Among the key buildings you can walk by are the Cathedral built during a period of 108 years from 1688 to 1796, the Flat Arch, Jesuit Convent, now refurbished housing the La Compamia Hotel nearby, San Jose Church showcasing the Golden Altar moved from Panama la Vieja Cathedral remains of the City Wall next to Plaza Herrera and many other historical places.



EMBERA VILLAGE TOUR

Embark on a thrilling 6-to-8-hour adventure to Chagres National Park and immerse yourself in the fascinating world of the Embera Tribe. Your journey begins with a scenic boat ride down the Chagres River, setting the stage for an unforgettable experience.

Discover the raw beauty of nature as you visit a breathtaking waterfall, a natural wonder hidden deep within the park's lush landscape.

Arriving at the Embera Indian village, you'll have the privilege of meeting the tribe's welcoming members, delving into their customs, and experiencing their way of life firsthand. Be enchanted by traditional dances that resonate with ancient rhythms and admire the intricate handcrafts that tell stories of generations past.



Your tour takes place in the jungle. It is not a theme park. As such, there are rivers, waterfalls, animals, birds and reptiles that can be encountered during the tour. When taking the tour with children, keep them with you. Don't allow them to go off on their own. Adequate footwear for the area is essential. It is important that you heed your guide's instructions at all times.



Canoe trip: A trip in a traditional canoe along the Chagres River within Chagres National Park.

Hike and waterfall: A short walk through the rainforest to visit and swim at a hidden waterfall.

Cultural presentation: A welcome featuring traditional music and dance, the history of the community and craft demonstrations.

Traditional lunch: Fresh fish (or chicken) served with patacones and seasonal fruit, all wrapped in banana leaves.

What to bring: Comfortable, lightweight clothing that can get wet, as well as a swimsuit and a towel. Trainers or sandals with good grip for walking on wet trails or crossing the river. Insect repellent, sun cream and cash in US dollars to buy local handicrafts (such as basketry or tagua carvings).

SISIMAKE DEGREE

This new charged activity was first put into a play in 2023, following The Son of a Ditch Degree's based on Panamanian history i n a play based upon the Guna Indian Culture.

The Gunas live in a 365-island archipelago in the Atlantic Coast East of the Panama Canal, an island for each day of the year.



The Gunas are an ancient culture with their own rules governed by Sagilas or Caciques, any dispute is resolved by the General Council and are final.

The plot is about a young man and a girl who have extramarital sex, the girl gets pregnant and her father a former Sagila takes the case to the council.



NITE A PHUN

Hop in a bus for nightlife enjoyment, it will take you to two of the oldest and traditional cabaret shows around Rio Abajo Township, La Gruta Azul and Paris Club.



La Gruta Azul opened its doors in 1914, the same year the Panama Canal opened its transits across the Pacific and Atlantic Oceans. Paris Club did it in the 1960's, both are icons never to miss, a visit is worth more than you can imagine.



Watch beautiful young ladies dance on the stage, true and live enjoyment for your eyes. Off stage they walk around, you may ask any of them to do a table dance in front of you or may sit for a while at your table. Beware! if they ask you to invite them for a drink, they will not accept one if you have a bottle on your table, they get served special ones only for them, those drinks are quite

expensive, at least \$15 a shot, if you are carried on, buying more than one don't be surprised when you get the tab, may run for over a \$100.

SON OF A DITCH DEGREE

Our signature degree based in the Panama Canal construction era, was first played in the late 1990's in the 4th Country Ceremonial held in Panama City when the Panamanian Flag joined those of Canada, Mexico and USA as the fourth flag on the Shriners and never adopted by Abou Saad.

Back in 2013 it was included as the closing activity on Saturday repeated ever since.



The journey takes the candidates throughout a jungle, meet the great boa, greet the Fuckarwi Chief, after the jungle walk, go through a simulated canal transit, step into the Atlantic Ocean, up Gatun Locks, through Gatun Lake, Pedro Miguel Locks, Miraflores Lake ending in the Pacific Ocean.



It is given free of charge to first offenders.
