Experiment 2

The IAT portion of Experiment 2 was identical to that of Experiment 1 except that participants did five rounds (instead of four) and that each IAT round always had the distinctive career group for each major (while in Experiment 1 we also included some non-distinctive pairings).

Here we provide screenshots of the parts of Experiment 2 that concerned the belief elicitation. This belief module was randomized to appear before or after the IAT task.

Analogous questions to the one above appeared in a random order for all ten of our major groups.

Experiment 3

Experiment 3 had four parts that occurred in a random order. The first was a beliefs module identical to that of Experiment 2 (see above for screenshots of those questions). The other three were 1) a open-text elicitation of participants' stereotype of a randomly chosen major, 2) A module eliciting which jobs participants are aware of, and 3) a module explicitly eliciting which careers participants associate with each major. We show screenshots from each of these latter three modules below, along with instructions screens where they differed from Experiments 1 and 2.


